LAKE ELSINORE — RYAN CHRISTIANSON has been on a quest for perfection for over a decade. He has been a scratch bowler for that long, but had never bowled a perfect game. Perfection was his number one bowling goal. He has been talking about bowling 300 since I met him, about four years ago. Well, Ryan has finally done it. He bowled 300 last week, in a practice session, at TREVI LANES.

Over the years Ryan has bowled some pretty high scores, but no perfecto. In 2005 he had a 830 (256 - 277 -297) at Rossmoor Bowl, in Los Alamitos. In 2010, he rolled an 802 (280 - 289 - 233) at Trevi Lanes. Both series were certified in league play.

The 802 was the first ever bowled at Trevi Lanes. Trevi Lanes had been open for business for three years, when Ryan did it.

The conditions at Trevi are difficult, and Ryan proved he is a great bowler when he became the first to break the 800 barrier there.

During his decade of chasing a 300, Ryan had four eleven-in-a-row awards and two "VARIPAPA" 300's. Every time he would get close to 300, he would get tapped.

How does a man bowl two certified 800s but no 300? In Ryan's case, it was just bad luck.

Last Thursday that all changed. Ryan finished a long day on the road and was passing Trevi Lanes, on the way home.

It was 9 PM, and Ryan decided to go bowling to "DESTRESS." By nine fif-By nine fifteen Ryan was on the lanes, and his NANO kept coming off his hand perfectly. Shot after shot was perfect.

Ball after ball struck. It was surreal. There was no stopping Ryan. Eleven in a row, a ten pin tap, and Ryan had a 299. Twelve more strikes and Ryan had his 300! Ten more strikes, a ten pin spare, and Ryan had a 289.

Three games and Ryan had a 888 (299 - 300 - 289). Trevi manager, DINO CASTRELLO witnessed every shot and said he had never seen anything like what Ryan did. Thirtyfive perfect shots and thirtythree perfect strikes!

Every ball hit the pocket and "EXPLODED" on impact. Dino said: "Ryan should have shot 900."

BIDWELL YOUNGEST TO WIN NEW MEXICO OPEN TITLE

RIO RANCHO, NM - Devin Bidwell of Simi Valley, California at 22 is the youngest winner at the 8th New Mexico Open tournament at Tenpins & More last weekend. Bidwell, who attends Wichita State University in Kansas, bowled a record 285 in the championship match to beat veteran pro bowler, Mike Edwards of Tulsa, OK 242, for the record \$ 7,500 first prize.

The versatile, tall right-hander also won the "True Amateur Tournament" (TAT) and finished sixth in the "High Roller" in Las Vegas, NV last month. He was a Junior Team USA member last year, capturing two silver medals in the doubles and singles events at the World Championships in Finland.

Sunday, Bidwell, who was third after 13 games of qualifying, 27 pins behind Wichita team-mate, Keith Ubert, found a way in to the pocket in game six of match-play by straddling the ball return, taking shorter steps and firing the ball with speed between the fifth and sixth arrow.

He shot 222, 218, 233, 268, 217, 246 and 255 to win all seven and add 210 bonus pins. His 255 beat Ubert (217) in the position round and gave him the top-seeded position by one pin, also a tournament record.

George Gohagan 111 of Georgia, the top left-hander, finished third, ahead of Marvin Hale of San Francisco and Edwards in fifth

In the first match on freshly-oiled lanes, Edwards opened twice early but had a two-pin lead over Hale who opened his fifth and sixth frames. Hale stayed alive sparing the 3-10 in the seventh and the 4-7-10 in the next frame.

Both struck the ninth but Edwards pressure-packed strike in the tenth gave him the nod 191-168.

Edwards bowled Gohagan and had to spare three six-counts (1-2-4-10; 2-4-5-8 and 1-2-4-8) but the rest of his game were strikes (6) or single pin spares (2) for 216. The leftie, strong as an ox, and with a tremendously consistent release, shot an unlucky 204 that could have been 224 had he not left a "fast 8" (6-10) in the middle of four strikes.

Edwards, boosted by that win, started with four strikes to overwhelm Ubert, leading by 58 pins after seven frames. Ubert's gallant turkey closed the gap but he took third 178-211.

The championship match saw Bidwell open with ten strikes. He looked like he could strike "forever", but the next shot came off his hand too quickly.

He hit the "out-of-bounds", it sailed sixty feet and got a fivecount. Edwards had a turkey, four-bagger in losing by 43 pins for second place of \$ 3,975.

Notes:

* The tournament attracted a record 189 bowlers from 14 states, including a record 12 women. USBC Queens champion, Missy Parkin, won the high female finish in 61st place

* The high senior was Jerry Smith of Colorado in 14th place, missing the cut to match-play by three pins.

* The pay-out went down to 72nd with 1,738/9 the required score. 48th place was 1,801/9 won in a tie-breaker, 191-189 by Chris Klerk (AZ) over Geoffrey Young (TX).

* It took 2,703/13 to make the match-play finals.
