DARRON PETERS Is California's **Top PBA 50 (Senior) Bowler**

TEMECULA The BOWLING NEWS published the final 2014 PBA 50 (Senior) Tour statistics a few weeks ago and they showed that our own Darron Peters is among the PBA Senior Tours (now renamed PBA 50 Tour) top performers this season. He is the only Californian on the Senior Tour's Top Twenty Competition Points List and he and Dale Eagle are the only Californian's on the Top Twenty Earning's List.

Darron placed eighteenth on the points list (73,240 points) and finished twentieth on the earnings list (\$10,025). The only senior bowlers above Darron on the PBA lists are pretty much PBA Hall of Famers or super stars with multiple PBA titles.

The points list is led by Walter Ray Williams, Pete Weber, Tom Baker, Norm Duke and Parker Bohn III. The rest of the list contains names such as Edwards, Goebel, Jurek, Mohr, Monacelli, Pedersen, Petraglia, Sullins, Voss, Webb and DARRON PETERS. The earnings list is led by Walter Ray Williams, Tom Baker, Pete Weber, Norm Duke and Jack Jurek.

Peters accumulated his impressive statistics in eight tour events out of the eleven national PBA 50 tournaments this year. Who knows how much higher Darron may have placed if he didn't miss three east coast tournaments.



Dave Soutar still leads the all-time PBA 50 Career Earnings List with \$586,370. He won seven titles. John Handegard is the all-time titles winner with fourteen.

Darron is a CITRUS BELT bowler, usually competing in leagues at Cal Oaks in Murrieta. We are proud of his accomplishments and look forward to his winning a national PBA 50 senior title next year.

There is no such thing as tournament time — because there are fine tournaments being conducted 12 months of the year.

Ever stop to think of how many bowling tournaments are available in the world each year? An educated guess might put the figure at more than 10,000.

There are big money, small money and no money tournaments. There are family, school, church, business, profession, city, county, state, sectional, national, zone, continent and world tournaments. There are pro tournaments and amateur tournaments and pro-amateur tournaments.

There are singles, doubles and team tournaments. There are events for boys, girls, men, women and mixed covering every age. There are sibling tournaments, husband and wife, father and son, mother and daughter, and any other relationship tournaments.

There are club tournaments and shop tournaments and office tournaments and religious tournaments. There are tournaments for people who can't see or can't walk or can't hear.

And with all that only a small percentage of the number and scope of the variety of bowling tournaments staged annually have been touched upon.

Yet, many bowlers never have rolled in a tournament.

Let it be known that there is a tournament for every bowler, regardless of the size of your average-or budget. Look through any bowling publication, check the desk or bulletin board at your bowling centers and read all your communications and you're sure to find one or two tournaments designed just for you.

Tournament bowling is the extra icing on the bowling cake.

Tournament bowling is fun, and always profitable. It isn't always profitable in a financial sense, though many have won cash, merchandise, trips and other goodies, large and small. But you always enter into a new and exciting phase of the sport where the competition is different but the game is the same.

How can you tell if a tournament is a good one? Check out those conducting the tournament, where it is being run, and read closely all the rules and fine print on the entry blank. A tournament survives only if bowlers are given a fair shake and tournaments don't last unlesss they have needed participation.

In many tournaments, particularly local and state and national association events, plus most charity tournaments, many dedicated people work hours that would stagger the imagination.

In some tournaments you can win six figures or more. In others you can't win much more than satisfaction in being a player, and maybe a title and trophy, be it thimble size or taller than you are.

You can't gain the full rewards bowling offers unless you roll in tournaments even now and then.

So give your local or

state tournament a whirl. Don't miss some of the fine competition your local center offers. Check out tournament clubs. There is as wide a variety in tournaments as there is in the aims of bowlers but bowlers can find the right one with a little effort.

If you've never rolled a tournament, roll one in the near future. If you have, roll one more.

NORWALK — Southern California Deaf Traveling League's 55th season opener at Keystone Lanes had an unusual bad day when all six teams bowled below their team average. League secretary Bob Taylor's Eagle Rock team nearly swept Jeff Stansell's Mid City 15-5 to place first in this early season. Mid City's Paul Taffolla won 4 points and Celia Salcedo one point to prevent the sweep. Low's Hollywood team with Jim Mohr's 5 points beat Abakumoff's Riverside 12.5-7.5 to place second. Flores' Orange County rallied in 4th game to beat Jones' S F Valley 11-9 to place third.

The league thanks its long time host, Keystone Lanes management and staff for the tough bowling condition. The next host will be Jewel City Bowl on Sunday September 21 with bowling at Noon (not 1 PM as shown on schedule.) We hope the league will bowl better there.
