NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS NAVARRO HIGHLITES DEAF TRAVEL OPENER WITH 300-(4 GMS) 879

NORWALK — Southern California Deaf Traveling League's new season opener at Keystone Lanes started a new page in its 53 years history. Francisco Navarro rolled the league's second perfect game on the opening day of its 53rd season. Former member Carl Malucci hit the first one in late 1990's.

Navarro's 4th career gem came in his 4th game of 879 series. The hard throwing right- hander who lofts his ball 5-10 feet out on the lane started with games of 187-192-200 then his 300. The oddity is, Navarro said, his last 300 rolled 4 years ago was at Keystone's right wall end lanes 23-24 and the new one was on left wall 1-2 pair.

Navarro's 879 led the league's honor roll of 6 bowlers. A returnee Leroy MacMonagle who left 3 years ago, shown no loss of his skill with 839 from 234-217-173-215. League President Ed Abakumoff came 5 pins short of the 3rd 800 of the day with 153-193-245-204 for 795. Bob Jones closed with a 202 for 740, League secretary Bob Taylor hit a 224 and a lady, Anita Lorenzo had a 201. The day's top lady is a returnee, Celia Salcedo with 689.

Navarro helped his Covina team win 13-7 over Jones' S. F. Valley and MacMonagle also led his Orange County win 13-7 over Abakumoff's Riverside. With Covina and Orange County tied for first place, 3rd place went to Anaheim a 12-8 winner over Mid City and 4th place was taken by Whittier, a close 10.5 to 9.5 winner over Taylor's LA County.

Covina with Joe Gonzales's 163, Sharon Caldwell's 168 and Navarro's 300 led the team season high game with 631. Orange County with Pat Morford's 563, Wesley Kay's 677 and MacMonagle's 839 led team season high series with 2079.

The League thanks Keystone management and staff for hosting that happened with a milestone 300 game. Next travel date is September 23 at Brunswick Covina Bowl. The team schedule has the exciting match up set for Covina against Orange County and S. F. Valley against Riverside. Other match ups are Anaheim against LA County and Mid City vs. Whittier.

Back in Shape by Robert Ellison

Hope everyone had a nice summer. Now summer break is over- its time to start new year. Todays topic will be what to do getting back into the game. There are few tips to get back into the game.

First- It is important to get back into the game slowly; prior bowling do warm up exercises and stretches. At least 5 to 10 minutes of warm stretches. Also- when you practice warm ups, its important to remember this is when you are "warming" up your body. Do not worry about the scores as you need take care of your body.

Second- Look at the equipment you currently have. Over the summer- your thumb may have shrunk. You will need use thumb tape to put into the thumb hole. This is a good time to take out the old bowling tapes, and replace it with new bowling tapes. The surface of the balls may need to be cleaned or polished. If you believe you need new balls, there are many new balls on the market. Bowling ball manufacturers have released new balls since league ended last spring.

Third- If you want improve your scores/average, then make commitment to yourself practice. It's important practice on a regular basis - as this will help consistency on your game. Focus on your forms, rhythm, and picking up spares. You will notice difference when you practice more often before you bowl in league/tourmaments. Good luck and high scoring!

"I quickly found that you still have to be bowling at a top level to do well on the Senior Tour," said Monacelli. "The competition was very tough and I feel fortunate to do as well I did in my first year."

During his career on the PBA Tour, Monacelli won 19 titles and was the first foreign-born player to win PBA Player of the Year earning the honor back-to-back in 1989 and 1990. He is the only foreign-born member of the PBA Hall of Fame and was inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame in 2012.

"One of my first impressions of bowling on the Senior Tour was how fast time has gone by," he added. "Bowling with some of the guys I bowled against on Tour brought back a lot of memo-ries."

Also receiving votes for Senior Rookie of the Year were Bob Learn Jr., Mike Edwards and Lennie Boresch who each won one title during the season, and Bryan Goebel, Rick Minier, Paul McCordic, Joel Carlson, Brian Cooper, Randy Shewmake and Todd Kjell.

Hall of Famer Dave Soutar of Bradenton, Fla., who retired after more than 50 years of competing on the PBA Tour and Senior Tour, was voted the winner of the Senior Tour's Dick Weber Sportsmanship Award.

In a career that started in 1961, Soutar won 18 titles on the PBA Tour and seven on the Senior Tour and becomes the first player to win sportsmanship awards from both Tours. He earned the PBA Tour's Steve Nagy Sportsmanship Award winner in 1970.

"I've always respected my competitors and felt that if someone beat me they bowled better than I did and they did the job they were supposed to do," said the 72-year-old Soutar, who bowled in a record 259 Senior Tour tournaments. "I've always been pretty low key. If I got beat or wasn't bowling well I usually directed my anger at myself and not my opponents."

The Senior Rookie of the Year award was voted on by PBA members and selected bowling writers while the Sportsmanship award was voted on by Senior Tour players.

In the Round of 16, leader Dunn (1) swept through Chris Garcia (16) 2-0, Mark Curtis Jr. (2) needed three games to take Andrew Svoren (15), Joe Grondin (3) beat James Knapp (14) in three, Jerome Jordan Jr. (4) swept past Kevin Jones (13), Brittany Kolatzny (5) topped fellow Farm graduate Spencer Van Rijsbergen (12) in three, Newcomer Chris Valenzuela (6) took Bianca Taylor (11) in three games, Oscar Chan (7) swept past Baujee Harlan (10) and Wesley Low (9) needed three to eliminate Tyler Salverda (8).

In the quarterfinals, the battle of Palmdale went to Wesley Low Jr. over Ashley Dunn 2-0, Chris Valenzuela got hot and a couple 240's took out 3rd seed Joe Grondin. Oscar Chan upset 2nd seed Mark Curtis Jr. with a 279 game and Jerome Jordan Jr's 266 third game was too much for Brittany Kolatzny.

The semifinals matched up three JAT Open Division vets and new member Chris Valenzuela. Valenzuela took no time advancing past Oscar Chan 215-213 and 211-207 while on the other side of the bracket Jerome Jordan Jr. outstruck Wesley Low Jr. 232-179 and 193-183. In the championship, Chris Valenzuela came out striking 217-194 for the first game win and continued on with a 214-188 win and his first JAT title. Congratulations Chris for a fantastic debut!

WEST COVINA – The JAT Farm Club started its 2012-13 season on August 26th at Brunswick West Covina Lanes. We had a fairly decent turnout of 29 bowlers, getting used to a bright and sunny Sunday morning. We moved up about 15 bowlers to the Open division, so there is plenty of opportunity for you younger bowlers to make your mark. The lane conditions proved to be challenging for the young bowlers as only a few reportable scores (220 or better) were turned in. Lane conditions or just rusty – some bright new stars are taking the fore-front already. Our thanks to the staff and management of Brunswick West Covina Lanes for their accommodations.

In the qualifying round of five games, we had Daniel Martinez leading the pack behind games of 224-222-245. Close behind was Austin Thompson posting a 246 game, followed by Eric Torrance 235, Jonnathein Chambers 234, Ryan Weitzel 231-222, and Javier Zavala 228. We took the top 16 into the next round with Martinez being the only plus score at 78. Last to advance came in at minus 161.

In the match play round of five games, Thompson started to make his move with games of 236-220-257 and claimed the tournament high game. Martinez added a 222 game to keep his count up. Torrence made a big jump during match play moving up nine positions and Joseph Velick jumped seven places to get into the finals.

Those finals then started with the 5th seed Heather Morkes (-81) taking on the 4th seed Matthew Zweig (-41). Morkes jumped at the chance for a title as she got past Matthew 191-157. Now meeting the 3rd seed Velick (+10) she step it up a notch for another win, 244-204 and another step up the ladder. Morkes then faced off with the 2nd seed Martinez (+121) and was able to advance once again 168-159. Now in the final pairing against the top seed Thompson (+260), the gas tank may have been a little empty. Thompson took full advantage in the best of three games format and quickly dispensed of Morkes 212-172 and 226-200. Congratulations Austin on opening the new season in fine fashion.

Thanksgiving Day has been known as turkey day for centuries. And "turkey" remains the most used term in bowling, as it has been for close to a century. A "turkey" in bowling is three strikes in a row. There is no such designation for any other amount of strikes. They are simply known as doubles, four, or five or whatever number timers or baggers. The question I receive most often, and always has been is how "turkey" became such a permanent part of bowling jargon and its origin.

In the early days of bowling, and well into the 1940s, most bowling centers conducted special holiday tournaments, prior to Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter.

They are usually one or two game events at a modest entry fee, and the prizes were unique, ranging from gold coins to baskets of groceries to hams, chickens, ducks and of course turkeys, and in the early days, you could even pick out your poultry, still alive, at the nearest meat market.

In order to increase the number of entries, the tournament promoters put down very difficult lane scoring conditions, and to give the contestants a try at an extra bonus, they offered a turkey to any bowler who could rack up three strikes in a row.

So, whenever a bowler rolled three strikes, the other bowlers or spectators would yell, "That's a turkey." And the term "turkey" for three strikes became standard.

Two other famous terms are "Brooklyn" and "Jersey" — still used universally. The 1-3 pocket is the accepted spot for a strike by a righthanded bowler and the 1-2 for lefties. If you score a strike by going to the opposite side it is a crossover.

There was great competition between New Jersey and Brooklyn bowlers as far back as the 1890s and in derision of a crossover strike the Brooklyn bowlers called it a Jersey hit and the Garden Staters named it a Brooklyn.

Even the earlier term of crossover came about because the headpin was the focal point and cited as the Hudson River, so when a New Jersey bowler scored an errant strike it was described as going across the river, and the same was true of the Brooklyn bowler who hit the wrong pocket.

One reader asked what a chicken was in bowling. I never heard it used but would think that maybe it would be a double strike, a success a little less than a turkey.

It takes a long time for any term to be established in any sport but once accepted they become a part of the game. And "turkey" has long taken its place. Proof of that is that most automatic scoring machines emphasize three strikes in a row by having a turkey pop up on the scoring screen.

Maybe a new term was born after wayward winds messed up the outdoor lanes set up in Reno and created terrible scoring conditions for the five great finalists because of the dirt and debris flying on the lanes from 20 mile winds. One mag. named it the Dust Bowl Open instead of the Women's Open.
