One afternoon Chase was conversing with ELAINE HAGEN (USBC Hall of Famer) and myself and eloquently described the challenges faced by young people today. On another occasion we discussed the health issues related to smoking. It is hard to believe this young man just graduated from high school.

Oh I forgot, Chase is also a great bowler with the potential to be a PBA star. He can bowl with one or two hands and average 230 both ways! He prefers one hand and in some ways resembles MICHAEL FAGAN when doing so.

Others say his game has some of SEAN RASH in it.

As part of the Queens Tournament there were sweepers conducted nightly with many pros participating, including CHRIS BARNES, MICHAEL FAGAN, TISH JOHNSON, PETRAGLIA, JOHNNY JR., PAULA VIDAD, DAVE WODKA, and DIANA ZA-VJALOVA (2013 Queens Champion) to name a few.

Veteran PBA Tour champion tops Tom Smallwood to win World Series entry, RPI Finals berth

ALLEN PARK, Mich. -Brian Kretzer of Kettering, Ohio defeated Tom Smallwood of Saginaw, Mich., 215-200, Sunday to win the Professional Bowlers Association Central Regional Players Invitational title at Thunderbowl Lanes.

Kretzer, a 47-year-old onetime PBA Tour title winner, earned \$6,000, a paid entry into the PBA World Series of Bowling V in Las Vegas in late October and a berth in a new

Nicholson went and ended up going on tour with Hardwick and his buddies and became the "tour go-for". Along with Hardwick was Sam Baca. He and Len started a lane maintenance program in 1971. Nicholson mentioned his Phantom Internet Radio show that changes guests every week. Tune in to hear their 25-minute interview program. You'd be amazed at what you can learn as well as get to know some of Bowling's most interesting personalities!

Kids, like most grownups, love to throw things. That's why most of them get a big kick out of bowling when they first start. They can go hog wild throwing the ball every which way, and find it pleasant, relaxing and kind of adventuresome

But soon they discover there's more to better bowling than just throwing the ball. First they fine they must roll it, that brute strength rates second to touch and finesse, and that despite their smaller physical size, such a handicap is not fatal in bowiing.

They find they must roll the ball a certain way on certain lanes and they're not quite sure how to do it but they find that there are many little tricks. Their most important discovery comes when they realize they can use help.

It's useless to take a small child and attempt to teach him all about bowling overnight. He must have his fling at just throwing the ball.

Once he discovers that bowling isn't as easy as it looks, then it's time to take him in hand and start from scratch. Most kids don't want to be 200 averagers right away. They want to learn how to keep the ball out of the gutter first.

Too many instructors, and that includes parents, relatives, friends, admirers, and anyone else who happens to come along, try too hard to treat children like adults when it comes to bowling. A five, six or seven-year-old has to wait a bit before becoming an Earl Anthony or a Mark Roth.

Let them have their fun fling before they get down to the serious business at hand.

The most important fact about youngsters is the guiding factor in dealing with adults, too. And that is simply that each is an individual, with varying mental and physical limitations

So it is then that no age is too young for a child to start bowling, if the child is ready. As to equipment, weight of bowling ball, attire and other equipment, the same holds true. Don't rush any youngster, but don't hold back either.

We have a tendency to overdo many things. Bowling, in the same way as other forms of sports for children, must necessarily be regimented, organized as much as possible. For starters, that's great, but the youngsters must be given leeway too, in the areas where they are qualified.

Decisions on league matters that directly affect them should involve them in the decision making. Decisions on financial matters, safety and discipline are better left to older, and presumably, saner heads.

When we start a child in bowling, we are introducing him to a sport he or she may still be participating in 50 or 75 years later. That's why the start is so important. It sure could be the start of a great career or a fine amateur career, but more than likely it will just be a fine diversion over the years.

In most cases bowling has done a better job than other sports when it comes to junior activity, and it needs to get better every year.

Kids aren't nearly as mere as they used to be. They're bigger, smarter, and as the Fonz would say, "cool" as can be. They're our future.

We can help by lighting the first spark with a little extra care.
