

Danny Ontiveros Bowling is Back in Barstow

TORRANCE — Danny Ontiveros Jr. passed away unexpectedly on September 21, 2013 at the age of 38, after losing his four day battle to regain consciousness subsequent to a seizure and massive coronary.

started bowling Danny at the age of 8 at Clark Center Lanes. Over the years, he had racked up more than 30 sanctioned perfect games and countless 800 series, the highest of which was 867. He competed in the Junior Amateur Tour, the Greater Los Angeles Jr. All Stars, as well as in leagues at Moreno Valley Bowl, Forest Lanes, Saddleback Lanes, Fountain Bowl, Paradise Lanes, Del Rio Lanes, and most recently at Palos Verdes Bowl, where he was a manager and operated the pro shop.

Not only was Danny an accomplished bowler, he was also highly involved with his son, Ryan's activities, and served as a little league manager in Torrance Little League; a volunteer coach with the South Bay Surf travel ball 8U team Ryan plays on; and even as the basketball coach for the Howard Wood K-2 basketball teams. In addition to coaching, Danny played coed softball on the Springfield Isotopes of Torrance at Wilson Park (the team name a play on his favorite team the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim), as well as with the Hurricanes at Alta Vista Park.

Recently, Danny had become the number one fan of Aimee's Celtic band, Craic in the Stone, and had even started teaching himself the guitar, so



he could play along with their debut album. He had managed to get the chords to his favorite song Zombie down, and was starting to learn Chasing Cars, just because it was on youtube and seemed easy to him.

Danny leaves behind his beloved Ryan and Aimee; parents Danny Sr. and Roberta; siblings, Nani, Marcus, Dillon and Katie; and many other close family members.

The viewing will be Thursday, October 3 from 6-8 pm in the Green Hills Memorial Chapel at 27501 S. Western, Rancho Palos Verdes, 90275. Services will be Friday, October 4 at 11 am, in the same chapel, followed by interment. Reception to follow at Palos Verdes Bowl 24600 Crenshaw Blvd, Torrance, 90505.

A GLOVER MASTERS FIRST

BAKERSFIELD, CA — The 7th annual Don Glover Masters Scratch Tournament is only a couple of weeks away but the excitement is really starting to build as this year's event will feature all four Glover past champions—PJ Haggerty (2007 inaugural & 2011), Scott Norton (back-to-back 2008, 2009), Jeff Frankos (2010) and Eddie VanDaniker, Jr. (defending 2012)—returning to Bakersfield to compete! The event will take place the weekend of October 5 & 6 at Regency Bowling Center (820 Real Road) in Bakersfield.

Saturday will have two qualifying squads (9 am and 1pm) and Sunday will feature the Top Ten in Match Game Finals which starts at 10am. Entry fee is \$125 and \$100 for re-entries (cash only day of event). First place is guaranteed \$3,000.

California bowlers pretty much know who these Glover champions are, but their list of accomplishments is amazing and really rings out why "the best bowlers come from California!"

--PJ Haggerty, our inaugural Glover champion, a youth stand-out was the 2003 CA Chuck Hall Star of Tomorrow, was on Jr. Team USA (2004-2006), and won a silver medal in Doubles (2004 Youth World Championships in Guam), was a three-time Collegiate Most Valuable Player (Fresno State), achieved (3) First Place Team All American (Fresno State), was the 2009 PBA Northwest Player of the Year, was the 2012 Pam Buckner Open Champion, and two-time Glover Masters Champion. He was recently inducted into the Nor Cal Hall of Fame. His career so far has (63) 300 games and (31) 800 series with a high of 890. And, he is a six-time PBA Regional Champion.

--Scott Norton, our back-to-back champion, also a youth stand-out was also a CA Star of Tomorrow and has numerous youth accomplishments. His adult career highlights are 2009-2010 West Region PBA Rookie of the Year, then in 2010-2011 the National PBA Tour Rookie of the Year.

He was selected on the First Team All American (2012-2013), has (5) Regional Titles and (3) PBA National Titles plus we watched him help win the first PBA League this past winter bowling on Billie Jean King's team. He was just selected by PBA Reps. as one of the sixteen PBA stars qualified for the upcoming Japan Cup that will be taking place Nov. 28-30 in Tokyo.

--Jeff Frankos, another former youth bowler, who's best friend, the late Tony Reyes, both bowled in the 2010 Glover Masters and ended up bowling against each other for the title, was the Cal State Masters Runner-up in 1999 and then went on to become the Cal State Masters Champion in 2000. He has (17) PBA Regional Titles and has been the Regional Player of the Year for the West Region. He has many 300 games as well as many 800 series and served on the Columbia Staff, Vice Grip Staff and Dexter Staff.

--Eddie VanDaniker, Jr., bowled for the first time in the Glover event last year and won the title. For his young age, he still has quite the resume with (96) 300 games, and his high career series to date is an 877. He has (2) PBA Regional Titles, was the 2012 CA Scratch All Events winner, as well as the 2012 Nevada Scratch All Events winner and the 2012 Don Glover Masters Champion. For 2013 he is a Team USA member where he received (4) Gold medals, (2) Silver Medals and (1) Bronze. He also is the owner of two locations of The Right Fit Pro Shop.

The defending champion reflected on his experience bowling in last year's Glover Masters: "My experience bowling the 2012 Don Glover Masters had some mixed feelings. It was a very competitive grind which brought the best shot makers in the tournament to the top of the standings. Winning a tournament named after such a great bowler, with my wife, Nicole, there to share in the moment, was the great part of this weekend. Barely making the cut into the top 10 match play had me a little uneasy as a few things went my way to get me in.

More importantly, last year's tournament was bowled with a lot of heavy hearts. Everyone in the bowling industry lost a great friend, Tony Reyes, earlier that week and we were still thinking about him as the weekend went on. I'm looking forward to coming back and defending my title against a larger field as every week is a test to see where you stack up against the other talented bowlers on the west coast."

You'll be able to catch these fine bowlers in action at the upcoming Glover Masters in Bakersfield along with many other scratch bowlers from the western region. This year's event will feature the Bourbon Street pattern on wood lanes. Again this year the event is open to both youth and adult scratch bowlers. LAS VEGAS — When I received the latest Deaf Bowling Classics and Tournaments Schedule by email from Walter Niesluchowski, I noticed that there is a new 1st annual Deaf Senior Bowling Tournament starting this October in Maryland. That is right along with Deaf Senior Bowlers of America (DSBA) 17th annual Tournament this October 15-17 in Las Vegas.

Why two tournaments in the same month for the deaf seniors to choose?

Apparently, as DSBA is a fixture bowling annually in Las Vegas at The Orleans Hotel Bowling Center, many Eastern senior bowlers want to bowl but disliked going to Las Vegas each year. It cost them more money to fly there and too far to drive.

While DSBA in as early as last November made it's October 15-17 dates known, the new group should show its respect to the older group by selecting different dates. There are some senior bowlers who would be happy to enter both tournaments even if scheduled a month or so apart.

As I do not have the new group's flyer, so its rules and format may be different than DSBA.

Therefore I contacted DSBA Secretary-Treasurer Ed Abakumoff who also did not have a flyer. Abakumoff is curious because he would enter in the new tournament if it were on different date.

After I told him that I would miss bowling this year in Las Vegas because of family plans on that week. That would be my second time in 17 years.

Abakumoff announced that DSBA has 75 senior entries in this October tournament and needs one more senior for doubles. He also said that someone informed him that the new senior group has 90 entries. Not surprising because there are lots of deaf senior bowlers in both central and eastern sections of US.

- round of six (6) games held after second qualifying squad is completed. No carry-over for top 20. If you qualify in first squad, you cannot bowl second squad.
- Top (10) scores advance to Sunday's Match Game Semi-Finals. Totals from Saturday carry over on Sunday for 2. Semi-Final. Semi-Finalists will draw numbers for lane assignments.
- 3. Nine (9) games of head-to-head Match play. Each match game victory will be worth (30) bonus pins.
- 4. Tenth (10th) game is a Position Round with (30) bonus pins to winner of match.
- 5. Top five (5) scores (including bonus pins) advance to Step Ladder Final.
- Ties to be broken by bowling a 9th and 10th frame, where required (except for 1st place tie—then a full game roll-off 6. shall be used). Should a tie still exist, a 9th and 10th frame shall be bowled until a winner is determined.
- High qualifier for Step Ladder Final will have choice of starting lane of a designated pair. 7.
- If a contestant fails to check in prior to the start of the scheduled round of Match Play, the first alternate from the 8. qualifying round will be given the opportunity to replace them.

Rules and Procedures:

- 1. Entrant is required to show their current USBC membership card when checking in.
- 2. Open to all USBC card holders.
- Entry fee must accompany entry blank. 3.
- Check in 1 hour prior to squad time (Sat). 30 minutes prior to Match Game (Sun.) 4.
- 5. No open play will be allowed prior to tournament play on tournament lanes, same day.
- 6. All bowlers move two (2) lanes to the right after each game in gualifying.
- 7. All entrants shall be responsible for correct scores and total on score sheet.
- 8. Bowling attire: Participants are requested to wear garments in good taste and appropriate for championship tournament bowling -ie., slacks, collared shirt with name on back (preferred). No iPod or iPhone headset listening

ARE PRO BOWLERS ATHLETES?

You've heard that one before, and you'll hear it again and again. Of course they are.

Dictionaries tell us that an athlete is one who contends for a prize. The word books also define an athlete as anyone trained or fit to contend in exercises requiring physical agility, stamina, and often strength.

The pro bowler, male or female, fits, with the possible, and probable, exception of strength. Tough strength is helpful at times, it isn't vital. The type necessary in pro bowling is not the brute strength so needed in the heavy contact sports.

In pro bowling, timing, coordination, and a delicate touch add up to a high degree of finesse needed to go along with limited force to score consistently. Pro bowling takes rhythm, balance, and skilled muscular effort. The muscles must be supple and toned, in shape, strong, but not rock hard.

A pro bowler must be competitive. He pays to play, unlike baseball, football, basketball and other players who are paid to play. The bowler's pay is what he wins, and he cashes only with superior performances.

Dedication is a must for any athlete. A pro bowler must spend long hours for many years perfecting and maintaining his skills. There is a growing school of thought that today's bowling equipment might be better than the players and that this is cutting down on the time needed to get to the top. True or not, too many times a pro bowler is classed with the average fun bowler. That's akin to equating a touch football game at a picnic with the Super Bowl.

IDLE BOWLING THOUGHTS

... It is amazing that people find it difficult to understand why the merger that created the United States Bowling Congress has run into some sharp pebbles in smoothing the road. You can't take more than 100 years of habits and experiences, millions of bowlers, hundreds of paid workers, hundreds of thousands of volunteer workers, a changing sport and business, and expect all the pieces to fit together as quickly as a first grader's puzzle. Patience not only is needed, it is a must from all involved.

...Bowling balls are expensive, but they always were. Back in 1907 the newest rubber balls sold for \$15. For many, that was more than a week's pay. And those good looking high top bowling shoes set you back anywhere from two to five bucks, but they lasted for years and years.

... An old newspaper clipping, dated Oct. 25, 1897, reported that Detroit had four bowling leagues that year. In three of them "palm" balls were used, and in a newly formed six team circuit the new "finger" balls were used. And here we are, 110 years later, and the rage in some areas is two handed palm bowling.

... Watch the great instructors in action. They not only teach, they inspire.

... A very little boy told me about the match he had against one of his friends. It was close all the way until he knocked down a pin in the seventh frame to win out, 1-0.

...Good guys never finish last, not if they are good enough.
