KELLY KULICK TO BARE ALMOST ALL IN OCT. 7 ISSUE OF ESPN THE MAGAZINE

NORWALK — Kelly Kulick, the only woman ever to win a PBA Tour title and a three-time PBA Tour exempt player, will be among a select group of athletes who will bare almost all in a "Body We Want" section of the Oct. 7 issue of ESPN The Magazine.

Kulick, the 2010 PBA Tournament of Champions winner, will appear along with gymnast Alicia Sacramone, snowboarder Gretchen Bleiler, soccer goalie Hope Solo, NBA star Blake Griffin, New York Mets shortstop Jose Reyes, St. Louis Rams running back Steven Jackson and several other athletes who posed nude – discreetly – for ESPN The Magazine's third annual "Body Issue."

All of the athletes will appear naked or barely-clothed (with private parts strategically covered), ESPN The Magazine editor-in-chief Chad Millman told USA Today. It will be the magazine's third "exploration and celebration of the athletic form," he noted.

Other female athletes bar-

ing their physiques will be WNBA competitor Sylvia Fowles, LPGA rookie Belen Mozo, track and field star Natasha Hastings, hockey player Julie Chu, tennis player Vera Zvonareva, surfer Steph Gilmore and tattooed roller derby player Suzy Hotrod. The other male athletes will be speedskater Apolo Ohno, NHL player Ryan Kesler, UFC light heavyweight champion Jon Jones, IndyCar racer Helio Castroneves, boxer Sergio Martinez, marathoner Ryan Hall and paralympian Jeremy Campbell.

"In the short time we've been doing it, this is an issue that has become pretty anticipated," says Millman. "In terms of the athletes we've attracted, we feel like the group is really strong."

PJ HAGGERTY WINS SECOND GLOVER MASTERS TITLE

BAKERSFIELD — PJ Haggerty has always been special to the Don Glover Masters Scratch Tournament as he was the event's inaugural champion in 2007. Since that year, Haggerty has returned every year to compete hoping to again claim a win but not until this year was he able to do so. Without a win in quite some time, Haggerty was hungry to again dominate.

Qualifying in the "A" squad on Saturday, October 1 at AMF Southwest Lanes, Haggerty made the cut with -34, averaging 194 for 6 games on the Glover pattern. This landed him in 4th place for that squad's top ten that was led by Dave Wodka at +74.

Returning to bowl later that day with the Top 20, Haggerty averaged 196 for 6 more

games which gave him a score of -55, which put him in 9th position to just make the Top 10 Finals for Sunday.

Haggerty earned third seed after bowling in Sunday morning's ten games of Match Play with +293.

The Step-Ladder Finals showcased some excellent bowlers who earned the right to compete. Fifth seed Wayne Garber, Modesto (+95) took on fourth seed Bill Nichols, Roseville (+180) where Nichols won 213-169. Then Nichols came up against third seed Haggerty, also of Roseville and after a tough match that went down to the tenth frame, Haggerty emerged 171-166. Next up Haggerty took on second seed, Bakersfield's Zack Newman (+359), and Haggerty again dominated 222-166.

Then came the final match-up with Haggerty against number one seed, Dave Wodka, Henderson, NV (+431). Wodka, who hot off just winning his back-to-back CUSBC (California United States Bowling Congress) Scratch Classic title, was the force all weekend

Diverse Group of 49 "Exempt" Players Set to Kick Off 2011-12 PBA Tour Season at World Series of Bowling

SEATTLE — Four first-time Professional Bowlers Association title winners, players representing six foreign countries, a returning PBA Hall of Famer and the oldest player ever to earn an exemption are among the 49 "exempt" players who will headline the 2011-12 PBA Tour when it gets underway during the PBA World Series of Bowling Nov. 4-20 at South Point Lanes in Las Vegas.

A focal point of the season for the elite group will be an exclusive new PBA Exempt Players Championship with a \$35,000 first prize and a \$191,000 prize fund during the World Series which also will give its winner an elite "Round of 32" berth in the season-ending PBA Tournament of Champions.

The four players who earned exemptions by winning their first PBA Tour titles during the 2010-11 season are Tom Hess of Urbandale, Iowa; Ryan Ciminelli of Cheektowaga, N.Y.; Scott Norton of Costa Mesa, Calif., and Osku Palermaa of Finland. Hess, as winner of the United States Bowling Congress Masters, earned a two-year exemption

through the 2012-13 season.

The strongest international presence ever will include representatives from six countries plus the United States: Australia (Jason Belmonte), Finland (Palermaa and reigning PBA Player of the Year Mika Koivuniemi), Canada (Dan MacLelland), Sweden (Martin Larsen), Colombia (Andres Gomez), and Venezuela (Amleto Monacelli).

PBA Hall of Famer Monacelli, a 19-time PBA Tour champion and two-time PBA Player of the Year, will return to full-time exempt player status for the first time in five years based upon his competition points performance as a non-exempt player last season.

And Kerry Painter of Henderson, Nev., at age 58, became the oldest player ever to earn a PBA Tour exemption when he finished eighth in the 2010 PBA Regional Players Invitational in Reno, Nev.

The 2011-12 exempt player roster also includes four additional PBA Hall of Famers (47-time titlist Walter Ray Williams Jr., 35-time winner Pete Weber, 34-time champion

Norm Duke and 32-time titlist Parker Bohn III), the only woman ever to win a PBA Tour title (2010 PBA Tournament of Champions winner Kelly Kulick) and, for the first time ever, three two-handed players (Palermaa, Belmonte and former Junior Team USA member Brian Valenta).

There will be nine first-time exempt players next season: Hess; Larsen and MacLelland from the 2010-11 PBA Tour competition points list; Steven Black, Johnathan Bower, Paul Gibson, Tyler Jensen and Painter from the 2010 RPI, and Valenta (2010-11 Tour Qualifying Round points leader), but the race for PBA Rookie of the Year honors will be limited to non-exempt players because all of the first-timers have exceeded Rookie of the Year eligibility rules (appeared in more than three Tour events in one season and/or seven total Tour events).

And the PBA Player of the Year chase will have plenty of contenders among the exempt players. Past winners of that honor are Williams (seven times), Duke (twice), Koivu-

niemi (twice), Bohn (twice), Monacelli (twice), Chris Barnes, Tommy Jones, Patrick Allen and Wes Malott.

The oldest player in the group is Painter (who turns 59 on Dec. 23) and the youngest is Bower, who will celebrate his 23rd birthday on Dec. 14.

While the exempt players are automatically qualified for all PBA Tour events this season, the three World Series events that will showcase the exclusive group are the Carmen Salvino Classic, the Exempt Players Championship and the Mark Roth-Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship.

The Salvino Classic will be open to the exempt players and a minimum of 15 non-exempt players who will qualify through a Tour Qualifying Round. Qualifying rounds in the Salvino Classic will be combined with EPC qualifying games to determine the top 32. Another six-game round will reduce the EPC field to 16 finalists and those standings also will determine the players who will be paired up for the PBA Doubles Championship.





Chapter 2

The Education of Lenny

Was Lenny just lucky, or did he know something that Mark didn’t? To be sure, he knew many things that Mark did not, the most important of which was *how to think like a bowler!*

He knew better than to complain about the lane conditions; they were the same for both teams. He understood that the game was really about “reading” those conditions and adjusting to them.

He knew to ignore Mark’s antics. Nothing his opponent ever did was important. He wasn’t bowling against Mark; he was bowling against *the pins*.

He knew that bowling was much more than just throwing a ball at the pins and hoping for the best. Bowling balls are *delivered*, not *thrown*!

He knew to ignore the scores. They were a distraction. They never mattered until the game was over, and they were merely a reflection of how well he had adjusted his skills to suit the lanes. He knew that high scores didn’t happen just because he wished for them; he had to make them happen!

He knew to ignore the fact that this match was for the league championship and that as the “cleanup” bowler, his teammates were relying on him for the win! He knew that in order to win, he had to give his team a chance to win. That meant nothing more than *making good shots!*

He knew that making good shots meant focusing on his technique and *nothing else!*

Lenny knew *technique!*

Lenny first picked up a bowling ball at the age of twelve and immediately fell in love with the game despite being lousy at it (he scored 29). He had watched another bowler practicing on the lane beside him roll one strike after another and wondered how he did that. The other bowler made it look so easy. Learning to bowl like “that guy” became a passion for him.

The pursuit of this passion, to become as good as “that guy,” became a lifelong quest. He soon discovered that anyone who even owned a bowling ball had advice to offer about the game. Sadly, he also realized that in many cases, the random bits of information he gleaned from one source would conflict with what another source would say. His real challenge evolved from simply learning all that he could about his sport to separating what really worked from what did not.

Now, at the age of fifty-three, he only bowled once a week but carried an extremely respectable 213 average! Yes, he definitely knew something Mark did not! He knew how to bowl! He knew what to focus on and what to ignore. He knew how to give his team a chance to win! Where Mark counted on natural athletic ability, constant practice, and emotion, Lenny relied on experience, education, a thoughtful strategy, and discipline.

Over four decades of bowling had taught Lenny that the only thing that mattered on the approach was technique ; repetitious skills that produced deadly accuracy. To his own surprise, his years of studying the sport had resulted in the discovery of a set of principles that govern successful technique. He refers to them as “the absolute truths of bowling.”

An absolute truth is simply a concept that applies to everyone whether small, medium, large, young, old, male, female, right-handed, left-handed, etc. They are as follows:

1. Bowling is a game of skill, not power.
2. What you do on the approach determines what the ball does on the lane.
3. The ball travels a line toward the pins.

Lenny’s father, a contractor, had taught him that “a strong house is built on a strong foundation.” When he decided to rebuild his game “from scratch,” these three principles became the foundation for that game. Using them as the basis for separating good advice from mindless drivel, he developed and choreographed a system of simple, well-defined fluid skills that he applied every time he stepped up onto the approach.

These skills are:

1. the Stance
2. the Pushaway
3. the Armswing
4. the RElease.

This SPARE system works for Lenny, but it will also work for any bowler. A closer look at Lenny’s system reveals why.

About absolute truth #1, *skill versus power*: Many bowlers never achieve their true scoring potential because they rely on their strength to throw the ball as hard as possible. They think that more power will knock down more pins. That may sound logical, but it’s not completely true for a number of reasons. Here are just a few of them:

1. You want to deliver strikes because strings of strikes produce high scores. That means rolling a very heavy ball a very long way (sixty feet) into a very small “pocket” over and over again. That requires accuracy and precision. Power alone simply cannot accomplish this because muscles are unreliable. They react differently each time you use them. When they are cold, they respond one way; once warmed up, they act another way. They tighten up; they loosen up; they get tired and sore. You get the idea.

Trying to develop a power game without first learning the *basic skills* is like trying to learn to drive a race car without using the steering wheel! All the power in the world is worthless if you can’t make it behave! Whatever strength you have is enough; you must develop skills that *direct* your strength, not vice versa!

2. During the execution of a “perfect strike,” the ball only knocks down four pins. An observer sees ten pins explode into the air, but the ball itself makes direct contact with only four of them! The *domino effect* knocks down the other six pins. It really doesn’t take a lot of power to make those four pins fall over, but it does require an extremely well-placed shot to set up a potent domino effect. Only proper technique results in accuracy that is consistent enough to produce strike after strike!

3. If bowling was a game of power, the sport would be dominated by former football players, body-builders, and professional wrestlers. It isn’t! Professional bowlers come in all shapes and sizes! Two of the best professional bowlers who ever appeared on TV were Earl “The Pearl” Anthony and Nelson Burton, Jr. They were not muscle bound behemoths! They were two of the smoothest bowlers you ever saw, and two of the greatest who ever lived! Both made a very good living by regularly beating “power bowlers” because they relied on nearly flawless technique.

Hopefully you get the idea. There is a place for power in the game of bowling, but it is *not* fundamental to the development of championship caliber skills! Like any sport, there are both *basic* and *advanced skills*. The *stance*, *pushaway*, *armswing*, and *release* are the basic skills. Power is one of the advanced skills. Build your game on a solid foundation of the basics because without them, you will never be able to develop advanced skills. Without them, nothing else matters (even if you’re lucky).

About absolute truth #2, *what you do*: The study of physics taught Lenny one universal law that proved insightful into the game of bowling. It is called “the law of cause and effect,” and it states that “nothing happens unless it is *caused* to happen.” As applied to bowling, it means that where the ball goes depends entirely upon what you do to it. If you want your first shot to slam into the pocket, then you need to develop techniques that enable you to send the ball slamming into the pocket! It’s really just that simple!

Look at it this way. The approach is fifteen feet long. The lane, foul line to headpin, is sixty feet long. The length of the lane actually *amplifies* any error you make in your delivery by a factor of four times! If you are one inch off at the foul line, the ball may end up as much as four inches off once it gets to the pins! This is why what you do must be repeatable, so that your results are *predictable*! It is why learning a *proper technique* is so important, so that you do the right things, not the wrong things (which get magnified)! It prevents or, at the very least, reduces the variations in your delivery that destroy your scores and make you utter the inevitable curse, “These lanes *suck*!”

This principle holds the key not just to making you a better bowler but also to making you a better sportsman and person. How? By helping you learn to take responsibility for yourself. You see, it’s easy to make excuses for failure, something for which bowlers are famous. This absolute truth forces you to face the reality that if your ball misses the target, it’s because you made it miss the target. Once you can admit that you made a mistake, it becomes a simple matter to figure out what it was. You can then eliminate that mistake by making an adjustment to your delivery. Learning to adjust is what makes you better!

About absolute truth #3, *the ball travels a line*: This statement is so simple and painfully obvious that you are probably wondering how it could possibly be of any importance to improving your game. To Lenny, it is the “holy grail” for which he had spent decades searching! What is good technique? This concept, the line, or more accurately the target line, provides the key to answering that all-important question. When combined with the other absolute truths, it unlocks the secret to determining what is important and what is not! It boils down to this: *GOOD TECHNIQUE IS REPEATABLE, PUTS THE BALL ON YOUR TARGET LINE, AND KEEPS IT THERE!* Any advice that doesn’t follow this rule is garbage because it leads to unreliable techniques!

This line begins at your shoulder the moment you take your stance and continues all the way down to the pins. It consists of two very distinct parts:

1. The path along which you carry the ball during your delivery.
2. The path the ball follows once you release it.

Good technique forms these two parts into one line seamlessly and effortlessly. Now, your improvement as a bowler (higher scores) merely relies on you:

– learning to mentally visualize this line in your stance. To do this, you must first roll a “practice shot.” The track the ball follows establishes a line. This line will be a function of the lane conditions. You need to visualize this line ending up in the pocket.

– practicing the skills as described so that you get the ball on that line and keep it there throughout your delivery. Tip: This line provides the basis for yet another very advanced skill: “reading” lane conditions. Once your line is established, only two things can change it: variation in either your technique or lane conditions. On a daily basis, properly maintained lanes are mechanically cleaned and then dressed with oil. This creates the lane condition. Balls rolling on the lane move this oil around, changing that condition. By eliminating deviations in your delivery, any change in your ball’s trajectory must relate to the lane condition. Reading these changes becomes much easier as you gain confidence in the consistency of your skills. Forty years of bowling taught Lenny that his father had been right—you need to build on a solid foundation. By themselves, the stance, pushaway, armswing, and release are just things you do to throw a ball down a lane to produce random results. These same four acts, developed into skills based upon three simple yet universal truths, became a delivery system.

They became a series of finely tuned motions, knitted together, which enabled him to become one of the elite bowlers in every league in which he competed. More importantly, these movements are so well-defined and simple that he found he could teach them to anyone! There is only one thing Lenny likes more than bowling well; teaching other people how to bowl well! It takes him back to his first bowling experience. He had watched that “other guy” in awe and wondered, “How does he do that?” Now he knows:

- The STANCE puts the ball on a line to the target, allowing
- the PUSHAWAY to move the ball along that line and set up
- the ARMSWING, which develops ball speed along that line, allowing
- the RELEASE to smoothly send the ball onto the lane without altering its trajectory.

Are you beginning to understand how easy the game of bowling really can be? Competency at any level depends on the mastery of only 4 basic skills! The real beauty of the “SPARE System” is not just its simplicity, but that it works so well, virtually anybody can learn, and master it. It’s even easy to remember because the term, “SPARE,” is an acronym for the skills involved; the STANCE, PUSHAWAY, ARMSWING and RELEASE. Lenny is all about easy . . . did I mention that he’s a crane operator?





All Hail California

Stolen from Jim Goodwin and his Stars & Strikes

NORWALK—When it comes to raising money for active duty and veteran Service men and women, California is the gold standard.

The beautiful State on our left coast too often gets a bad rap from the media and others about their politics and economic woes; but in raising money for the Bowlers to Veterans Link, California stands head and shoulders above the rest of the country.

We recently received an email for BVL Executive Director Elizabeth Montanya reporting that national contributions are up for the third consecutive year; pretty amazing when you consider the decline in league bowling, the weak economy, and the pathetic jobs forecast.

Helping BVL surpass the \$761,660 raised last season were more than 700 USBC associations, hundreds of bowling centers, and corporate partners. The top five states raised about \$215,000, with \$117,000 of it coming from California alone. Virginia is number two with about \$46,000. My home State of Texas is #3.

So what does California do that does not happen in other States? First, they have never abandoned the practice of talking to league bowlers one-on-one. They also hold tournaments, have bake sales, BBQ's and picnics, and they even put on a rodeo.

But the centerpiece of California's effort is the State BVL Tournament, with multiple divisions for men, women, boys and girls. The annual event was recently renamed "The Helen Duval Veterans Tournament." Duval passed away in 2010, but during her Hall of Fame bowling career, her passion and charity of choice was BVL; and she sang its praises as a national spokesperson everywhere she traveled for decades.

The current chairman of California BVL is Rosie Parker. She cites one of the keys to success is recognizing all who donate; even the small \$2 donations are listed. Every State Association gets a certificate with the BVL logo and the contribution total. The top three get special awards.

And the personal touch is not forgotten. They work closely with the VA Hospitals, homes and centers, making personal visits as often as possible. "Our debt to our veterans is profound," says Parker. "It is important for us to help and support those who give so much so that we may continue to enjoy our freedom and be safe here at home."

This strong commitment to BVL started in 1950 in California, when the bowlers declared "We won't forget you," to the veterans who bravely fought in World War II and Korea; and they have kept that solemn promise, raising more than \$8.6 million since then, far more than any other state.

Historically, in good times and bad, bowlers are a generous lot. It all started during World War II when bowlers, mostly women, raised hundreds of thousands for the BVL and the "Wings of Mercy" programs to support the war effort.

At that time, The Women's International Bowling Congress led the charge, donating more than any other sports organization; an incredible \$341,543, enough to buy a bomber and three air evacuation planes in 1940 era dollars.

That national spirit carried over to California. The WIBC War Service Committee was chaired by Violet Jean McClatchey, from New Jersey, who became the driving force behind the incredible effort. Violet would have fit right in in California.

Several very capable women are primarily responsible for the success in California. Aside from Duval and Parker are Elaine Hagin, Agnes Duffey, Joan Feinblum, Mary Lynly, and Joan Romeo; a formidable team by anyone's measure, and all have been active not just in California, but on the national stage as well. And there are others; too many to name them all.

Of course we realize that a few men were also involved, but in California and many other States, the women have been the driving force. Hagin was the chief architect of the success in California and nationally for BVL. She served as California Chairman for 12 years and as National BVL Chairman for 20 years from 1988-2008.

These women and others they have mentored have been tireless and selfless in their efforts for BVL and bowling in general. They are constantly starting project after project, and failure never seems to be an option.

And they did not stop at simply sending money to BVL. Other projects, like their program to send thousands of pre-paid phone cards to active duty troops, has been great. They also sent dozens of Carpet Bowling Sets to provide a little fun for those in war zones, among other projects.

When it comes to raising big money for soldiers, we would like to see all of the States follow the lead of California . . . To lead the charge, the theme song could be borrowed from a famous West Coast band - "We Wish They All Could Be California Girls."


