ABTA at Bowlium Lanes for Frozen HDCP Special

LAKE FOREST — We returned to super Forest Lanes where we saw 169 entries come out on Saturday for a nice time there. The cut scores were + 46 for the men and + 20 for the women, on a medium shot this week. The Super Seniors added to the board (two men and one Woman) were Manny Loria +38, Ed Palma +35, and Ester Licauco +15. Super seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 43 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

The Tourney High qualifiers were Gino Mansilungan / men with a +138 and for the women Beth Borci with a +127. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed draws the Match Series. This time it was worth \$286. Gino would draw the score and he drew a 586. We had one bowler that bowled this score and it was William Garrett, Therefore, we will estimate the Match Series at \$300 at Bowlium Lanes Saturday. Cezar Marcella was the last person standing for the 3-6-9. He missed on his third shot for the \$1,200 pot and got a \$50 consolation. The pot will be at \$1,300 at Bowlium Lanes.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Sam Wu and Jeff Wu with a 1445 for \$130. Finishing in second was Sam Wu and Billy Chao with a 1402 for \$110. There was a total of \$1,460 paid out in doubles and 28 paid spots with low to cash of 1303.

After the semi-finals, finishing in first was Jeff Wu with a +171. In second was Scott Johnson at a +120. So he sat out the first round of the top 16 single elims. Our top seed had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. Jeff drew a 201. After a review of all the scores bowled, unbelievably we had no bowlers match that score. We still have four full pots and now a fifth pot started that is at \$3,140, so next week we will go for \$3,500 again.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven los-ers were Sam Wu, Bennet Lai, John Licauco, Tres Catalasan, Giang Huynh, Jeff Taino, and Ammie Lubag. Each will get \$100. In the second round, the four losers were Scott Johnson, Robert Ricketts, Samson Kong, and Benjamin Chung each getting checks of \$105.

This would get us down to the final five bowlers. The weekly horses are paying a low of \$50. Freddie Catamisan, to a high of \$301, Bobbie Mc-Collum. In one match, the seventh seed Freddie Catamisan versus Leny Urrutia the fourteenth seed. This was another of our low scoring matches where Freddie advancing with a 182/204 to 120/173 final. In the other match, it was Kent Maruyama the third seed versus Bobbie McCollum the fifteenth seed. This was another one of the medium scoring matches, where Bobbie continued her march through the matches just finding a way to keep marking. She would take this victory with a 194/247 to 182/219 to advance. Kent and Leny finished in fourth and fifth getting checks for \$110 each.

Our semi-final match was all set now, and would pit the seventh and fifteenth seeds from the semis against each other. In the weekly "horses", we would see Freddie paying \$50 and Bobbie, the long shot, paying \$351 if they would win their match. This was again Bobbie's best bowling where she continued her way getting her marks with her straight ball. This made it tough on Freddie and an open in the third frame gave Bobbie a 40 pin lead. With Freddie unable to come up with a double, Bobbie was able to advance with a 179/222 to 172/196 to advance. Freddie would take home \$200 for his third place finish. For those lucky "investors" that had Bobbie as a horse, she paid \$351.

The title game was set and would be top qualifier Jeff Wu going for his first title and Bobbie McCollum going also for her first championship. Jeff would start out with a spare. Bobbie would get a strike and then an open. Jeff came up in the fourth and got a third straight strike but follow that up with a spare, and he would have a 30 pin lead. Bobbie got another spare in the fifth but another open in the sixth would seal her fate, as Jeff continued his marking and had a 43 pin lead after the sixth. Bobbie tried to make it a match with a double in the seventh and eighth, but an open in the ninth would end it for her. Jeff would finish with a 201/240 to Bobbie's 143/196 and take home his first championship. He would take home \$1,000 for the victory an additional \$1,700 for Cash and Carry, an additional \$100 for wearing his ABTA shirt to give him a total of \$2,800. Bobbie would take home \$500 for her second place finish.

Champion Jeff Wu is from Pomona and used a Roto Grip drilled by Billy Chao. He is single and thanks his brother Sam and Patricia Lin for all their support.

Bobbie McCollum, Runner-up Second Place, is from La Habra and used a Hammer drilled by Mike Wahl. She is married to another fine ABTA bowler Jack and they have one son and six grandchildren. She would like to thank the ABTA family for all their support and cheering through the night.
