## Wayne Webb Wins Columbia 300 **Traditions Bowling Classic – Reno** Claims \$4,000 1st Prize, Largest In TBC History

RENO, NV-PBA Hall of Famer Wavne Webb of Sacramento captured the title at the Columbia 300 Traditions Bowling Classic held at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno on October 21-22 2006. The event was presented by the RSCVA and the National Bowling Sta-

dium. Webb, the 1980 Firestone Tournament of Champions Winner, defeated Leo DiBenedetto of Rancho Cordova, CA, Lance Lopez of North Highlands, CA, and Richard Martinez of Yuba City, CA in the tournament championship match to claim a Columbia 300 TBC record \$4,000.00 first prize.

In the championship match, DiBenedetto gave Webb an opening in the 9<sup>th</sup> frame and Webb took full advantage shutting out all other opponents. Webb fin-ished with 235 to best DiBenedetto (226), Lopez (225), and Martinez (193). In winning the Columbia 300 TBC Reno event, Webb became the first bowler in Columbia 300 TBC history to shoot a 300 game during the tournament. Webb's 300 took place during the Cashers Round on Sunday afternoon.

The tournament paid out \$9,450 in prize money, an amount greater than collected entry fees, demonstrating the Columbia 300 commitment to competitive tournament bowling. Out of the 42 entrants in the event, 18 of the bowlers cashed, a ratio of almost 43%.

The Columbia 300 Traditions Bowling Classic moves to Middletown, OH (Dayton / Cincinnati area) for its next tournament to be conducted at Eastern Lanes on November 4-5, 2006. The Columbia 300 TBC circuit then heads for a November 18-19 tournament at Sunnybrook

WISCONSIN—Doug Kent became the first third-seed in his-tory to win a USBC Masters as he won three matches Sunday to capture the 2006 USBC Masters at the Wisconsin Exposition Center.

Kent knocked off top-seed Jack Jurek in the title match, 277-230, to win his second career Masters title and his second Denny's Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) Tour Major title.

The Newark, N.Y., native was unstoppable in the title match, overcoming an early deficit by striking nine consecutive times after opening the match with two spares. The key in that stretch was a late break in the 6th frame when the headpin came across the deck and barely knocked over the 10-pin.

Kent earned a two-season Denny's PBA Tour exemption with the win along with \$100,000.

"It's an honor to be in the company of so many great bowlers who have won this tournament, and it's an honor to be in that ' said Kent, who captured his eighth career Denny's PBA category," Tour title. "The two-year exemption for me is big because I've kind of been in the middle of the pack the last couple years."

Jurek, who had started the match with four consecutive strikes, let Kent back in with spares in the 5th and 6th frames. He bounced back with strikes in the 7th and 8th, but a 1-2-4-10 washout in the 10th all but ended the match.

Kent advanced to the title match with a 246-190 win over ama-teur George Lambert IV (Hamilton, Ontario), who was making his first appearance in a PBA championship round.

In the first match, fourth-seed Tommy Jones had a chance to beat Kent with a strike on his first shot in the 10th, but he left a 2pin. The 2005-06 PBA Player of the Year then struck to tie Kent at 248 through 12 frames which sent the match to a one-ball, suddendeath roll-off. Kent, as the higher seed, elected to bowl first and rolled a nine count. Jones then left a 2-4-8-10 split giving Kent the 9-6 win

Jurek (Lackawanna, N.Y.) earned \$50,000 for his second place finish while Lambert earned \$25,000 for third and Jones (Simpsonville, S.C.) won \$15,000 for fourth.

The Denny's PBA Tour moves to Taylor, Mich., for the 2006 Motor City Classic Nov. 1-5 at Taylor Lanes. The nationally tele-vised ESPN finals take place Sunday, Nov. 5 at 1 p.m. EST.

## **Mark Lewen Wins** Forest Lanes 6-Game \$300 Title

thing was nice; scores, 27-player field and an exciting finale. A nice guy from San Diego, Mark Lewen, won the Forest Lanes Saturday Six-Gamer \$300 title plus two \$27 high game pots, going home with \$354.

Lewen has been bowling "all his life" here in Southern California but he was a bit sad dedicating his victory to a friend, Casey Beasley, who died recently.

Casey, a frequent six-game visitor, took an occasional flier. After losing he would say, "I bowled pretty good but not good enough to cash"

Lewen remembered when Casey was a junior tournament "Angel" buying dinners, paying their entry fees, at times sponsoring junior teams and events.

Many of last Saturday's field also remember Beasley learning their ABCs in the JAT, All-Star Junior Traveler.

According to director Mario Marquez, the Six-Gamer was worth nearly \$1,100. Most of the cashers came out of our Southland junior ranks, from Ventura, San Diego, Los Angeles, Riverside and San Berdoo.

Lewen rolled a 299 high game and a pot winning 267 to make his 1427 series averaging 237. Jeff Garrison was second five pins under, 1422, cashing with a 266 game (\$27) and 737 series (\$54) winning \$281. Vernon Adams didn't win any sidepots but came close with a 257/720/ 1413 set settling for third (150). Paul Danforth was fourth, 1404 for \$100, while Mike Belair's first three 232-256-279 gave him the event's high series, a 767 and \$114 for his 1385. Others cashing \$27: Jeff Gordon 268, John Sowell 264 and Mark Wehrli 258. Writing about "Angel"

Beasley, there's really hundreds of Angels that spent much money, time, love, love of the game in Southern California and thousands nationally.

Beasley started bowling in the 1960 boom days. Perhaps at Pro 300 Bowl in San Pedro with a 159 average and rolling his last ball here in the Six Gamer,

breathing his last in Lakewood. It was nice Lewen reminded this writer about "Angel" Beasley. I knew he liked tournament competition and was acquainted with many of the players. I didn't know his involvement with young bowlers. I hope Lewen keeps bowling and wins many sweepers, regionals and a few pro events.

## National Deaf Bowling News Malucci's 983 Wins Kansas Deaf Classic \$1200 Prize

OLATHE, Kansas-Deaf Bowling Association held its 5th annual Deaf Individual Bowling Classic at Olathe Lanes East last October 21. My beloved correspondent from Olathe Don Ketter emailed me simply, "Carl Malucci won the \$1200 first place Kansas Deaf Classic with 983, runaway. He really bowled great and I bowled 901 plus 8 handicap for 909 to place 2nd for \$450.00.' Ketter continued, Sorry I don't have his 4 games scores.

Mine were 231-242-194-234. The third game did not go my way. I did have a good "strike area" but got a 7-10 split, oh well, sometimes you win, sometimes you lose, ha. But in no way I can catch up with him for he had a hot hand.

Of course, Ketter wrote, Carl entered again in the next squad and rolled a 965 (I think). Well, he deserved it!" He added, "Hmm, Kim Wroldsen entered in the men's division and placed 4th with 888 including handicap. Also Jerilyn Keller won the women's division. Again sorry I don't have their games and you have to ask Stacey for the complete results."

So, thanks to Ketter and while I wait for Stacey Thompson to respond, we knew that few weeks before this one, Carl Malucci won NDMBA's "Battle of Greatest Deaf Bowlers" against Detroit's Pete Kaczmarczyk in Las Vegas, I want the Whittier, CA hotshot Malucci to tell his story.

Malucci said, "the Kansas tournament had only two squads, 11:45 AM and 2:30 PM, so I entered in the first squad and shot games of 260-249-227-247 for 983. I didn't think my score of 983 was good enough to hold, so I entered again in the 2nd squad and shot 248-248-233-244 for 975.

My first score of 983, Malucci continued, was good enough to win the \$1,200.00 guaranteed first place prize.

Also I took about \$250.00 on the side for high game and series pot and brackets. Don Ketter who bowled with me on the first squad shot 909 for 2nd place ad another bowler whom I did not catch his name came in 3rd with 901. Kim Wroldsen who also bowled with me on the first squad, shot 888 to finish 4th".

Malucci added, "I think there were 39 entries which was small for them this year, maybe due to bad weather or other conflict. I want to thank Kansas Deaf BA the host of this deaf bowling event and they all did a wonderful job inside and out. I also want to thank Jennifer Vasquez and her daughter Samatha for coming along and for their moral support on this trip. I told myself that I wanted to come back and bowl in this event again after I bowled in it, I think 3 years ago when it was the 2nd annual tournament at that time'
