### USBC Elects Constantino Marchione to the Hall of Fame

by Ed Abakumoff USBC Hall of Fame committee elected Constantino (Connie) Marchione, well known deaf bowling writer, to the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame. The committee met this past Monday.

this past Monday. The next day after I had got-ten home from bowling in my Tuesday morning league, I be-gan to watch the PBA bowling that I had recorded. A short time later my phone rang. The per-son on the other end asked, "Is this Ed?" and I said "yes." He then told me that he was Jerry Schneider of USBC communications and that he needed some assistance and for me to keep a secret. I replied "Sure, what's up?" Jerry proceeded to tell me that Connie had been elected to the USBC Hall of Fame yesterday by the Hall of Fame Committee. I was elated and interrupted and said 'WOW, that is fantastic, Connie will be overjoyed to hear this." He also said that Mike Carroll, USBC Presi-dent, wants to officially tell him personally.

Jerry told me that he needed to know what would be the best way to notify him? He suggested email and I told he can call via telephone relay service. I explained to him what it was and how it worked. I asked Donna, my wife, for the relay phone number since I couldn't remember it. I gave Jerry the number and he told me that Connie will get the call that afternoon or the next day. I asked him about the induction ceremony and was told that it will be in March of next year in Nashville, Tennessee.

Before hanging up I said " I will see Connie this Sunday and I will keep my mouth zipped 'til then.

Connie Marchione is being inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame for his Meritorious Ser-

old ABC Masters format. The PCDBA Masters is named in his honor. Over the years he got deaf teams together to go to the ABC national tournaments. He did the same for the California State Men's Tournament. He ran the tryouts for the deaf USA bowling team for the World Games for the Deaf (WGD). Bowling was accepted as a sport by the WGD in 1997. Connie was responsible for forming the powerful record breaking team that went to Rome, Italy in 2001 for the WGD. The Rome team ran away with a Gold Medal in every bowling event. The WGD officially changed its name to the Deaflympics in 2001

I believe that Connie's baby is the Southern California Deaf Travel League. It is in its 47th year and Connie has been its only secretary/treasurer.

Connie had an award named after him, for recognizing the achievements of a deaf bowler in the previous year by the Southern California Bowling Writers.

In recent years Connie has had other awards bestowed on him. In 2005 in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, at the ABC convention, he received the Rip Van Winkle Award by the Bowling Writers Association of America (BWAA). Last year he was honored by the California Women's Bowling Association with a Distinguished Service award. This past June he was surprised by the BWAA with a Remo Picchietti Humanitarian Award.

This USBC Hall of Fame induction should certainly be the apex of Connie's esteemed career. He was always encouraging deaf bowlers to be the best they can be. This writer is one that took his encouragement to heart. When ever there was a deaf bowling event, he was usually there, either to write about it or get it off the ground. Mr. Marchione is well known through out the sport of bowling both hearing and deaf. Naturally he is known in the BWAA. Many PBA members and present Hall of Famers know him. So my friend, Connie, will be in good company when he is inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame

# Reyes Takes Motor City Classic

TAYLOR, MI-Tony Reyes' first career Denny's Professional Bowlers Association Tour title couldn't have been any sweeter.

Reyes made history by firing the 17th televised 300 game in the 47-year history of the Tour in the semifinals Sunday at Taylor Lanes, then defeated Wes Malott, 255-238, for his first career title.

The 33-year-old from San Bruno, Calif., knocked off PBA Hall of Famer Parker Bohn III, 300-215, in the semifinals, becoming the first bowler since Mika Koivuniemi in the Cambridge Credit Classic in Windsor Locks, Conn., on Dec. 17, 2003, to be perfect on TV.

Reves also became the third bowler — and the first since C.K. Moore in 1996 - to shoot 300 on his way to his first career title. Moore's 300 game also came against Bohn.

After firing the 300 game, Reyes refocused to knock off the top-seeded Malott, clinching the win with a strike on his first ball in the 10th frame.

"I did have some shaky legs trying to finish a 300 game for the first time since I can remember," said Reyes, who earned \$25,000 and an exemption for 2007-08. "I had to bring it back though after that shot. Business is business and Wes is a great bowler so I knew I had to shoot one more big game."

Reyes had a difficult 2005-06 season which included the passing of his father midway through the season. He finished just 51st in the 2005-06 PBA World Point Rankings, but earned his exemption for 2006-07 by wining a special event, "The Final Frame presented by the Denny's PBA Tour."

"I did it for dad. He was here Friday and he's here now. I can just feel it," Reyes said. "I've worked so hard over my eight years on Tour and to get to this

GREENDALE, Wis.— Online reservations are now being accepted for the 2007 United States Bowling Congress Youth Open Championships, which will debut at AMF Thruway Lanes in suburban Buffalo, N.Y., on July 13-21, 2007 (unless extended).

All USBC Youth members can compete at the USBC Youth Open Championships — there is no need to qualify. Bowlers will take part in singles, doubles and four-player team competition and vie for scholarships and national titles.

The inaugural event will be conducted alongside the USBC Junior Gold Championships and Pepsi USBC Youth Championships. Individuals taking part in the Junior Gold or Pepsi events will also be eligible to compete in the USBC Youth Open Championships.

The tournament will be broken into four average divisions (129 and below, 130-159, 160-189 and 190 and above) and will be based on actual pinfall. One out of every four entrants in team, doubles and singles will receive scholarships, while one in six will receive scholarships in all-events. To register online, visit the USBC Youth Open Championships page located in



the Youth section of bowl.com. A minimum \$100 deposit from a major credit card (Visa or MasterCard) is required to hold a four-player team reservation; full payment is due by April 1. Reservations made after that date must be paid in full at the time of registration.

Reservations also may be made by calling (800) 514-BOWL, ext. 3153 or by filling out an entry form printed from the USBC Youth Open Championships Web page and mailing it with at least the minimum deposit to USBC Youth Open Championships, 5301 S. 76th St., Greendale, WI 53129.

Online reservations close June 1, while mail and phone reservations close July 2. However, on-site reservations will be accepted as space permits.

# Patterson, Asbaty Ready To Roll At World Cup

CARACAS, Venezuela-As competitors walked in for the opening ceremonies of the 42nd QubicaAMF World Cup on Saturday, employees were still feverishly working to complete a massive modernization of the Centro Nacional de Bowling Mampote.

The start of the World Cup, one of the top international events that has attracted 94 countries, was even pushed back by a day so the installation of 40 new lanes, pinsetters and scoring units could be completed.

With the finishing touches finally done, the players took to the lanes Sunday for the official practice sessions.

"It's nice to throw some shots and get a feel for the lanes," said Team USA's Dan Patterson of Buffalo, N.Y. "I've got a good look, and I'm more than ready for this event to get going."

The final decision to hold the World Cup in Caracas as planned was finally made a little over a month ago when organizers were assured the venue would be completed.

With a tight schedule, there was no time for the lanes to be tested in advance, so when the women started their official practice Sunday morning, they were the first to throw shots on many of the lanes.

"I can say that I was the first one to ever throw a shot on lane 35 of this bowling center," joked Team USA's Diandra Asbaty of Chicago. "This is the first time I've ever bowled on a brand new installation, so it will be interesting to see how things go this week. The World Cup begins with all competitors bowling eight games of qualifying on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday before the field is cut to the top 24 men and top 24 women. After eight additional games Thursday, the field is narrowed to the top eight in each division for round-robin match play. The top three men and top three women advance to Friday's television finals. Asbaty will look to continue a wave of success for the United States at the World Cup. Lynda Barnes won the event last year, while Shannon Pluhowsky took the title in 2002 and 2004. Patterson will try to become the first U.S. champion since Patrick Healey Jr. won in 1995.

"My ball isn't finishing any more". " My ball is dead in the water". "My reactive ball has lost all it's hook". How many times have you or your teammates made these statements. It's a common theme that is going around bowling centers these days, but one that can be cured.

Today's reactive and particle balls are very porous and thus absorb a lot of oil and dirt from the lanes. The reason a new reactive or particle ball rolls so well is that the shell is fresh and it can absorb oil into the cover. This absorption gets the oil off the outside of the cover and allows the fresh shell to grip the lane. If today's performance balls weren't absorbent, the oil would stay on the outside cover of the ball and the ball would skid much farther down the lane before reacting.

When your ball starts losing reaction it's because the pores in the shell are full of oil and dirt as well as broken down plasticizer. Plasticizer is the material shells are made of, and when this plasticizer starts to break down inside the ball, it migrates toward the cover filling the pores from the inside out. The combination of this plasticizer filling the pores along with the oil and dirt the ball has picked up over games of use, causes your ball to "die" and lose hook.





ter on medium, oily lanes without rolling too early. This polish can be used on reactive, particle, urethane and polyester balls.

The 1200 grit polish is for medium to dry conditions. This polish will give your ball a high luster finish, create a more skid snap ball reaction and increase the back end finish. This polish can be used on reactive, particle, urethane and polyester balls.

The 2000 grit polish is primarily to be used on your ball for dry conditions. This polish will create a high luster on the ball along with a slightly slippery surface feel. This works well on dry conditions as well as for bowlers with slower ball speeds.

Remember, you can alter the surface of any ball to give you a ball reaction that will be better suited for a lane condition that gives you trouble.

# (Bowling Improvement Quotient)? **Conclusion More on the Importance** of Advanced Fundamentals

Checking over last month's article, you may wonder why it is that certain advanced techniques can be called fundamentals. After all, fundamentals are usually categorized as basics, aren't they?

Well, think about it for a minute; advanced bowling techniques come in two main categories...those, which absolutely must be done in order for success to be possible ... and those about which there is a choice. It is those must be done ones, which come under the heading of advanced fundamentals.

In other words, your particular bowling style is your own...and styles often differ greatly from bowler to bowler. This is why the best coaches usually have a policy of never changing a bowler's style, but rather improving that bowler's game within the style the bowler already has! And even if you are a low average bowler, you still have your own style.

This is also why, when watching the PBA finals on TV, you'll often see even the world's top bowlers scoring within a few pins of each other, while looking very different from each other during play.

So here are some more of these items, added to the ones

#### from last month's article. **Matching Ball Speed** and Revs

This is a subject, which few bowlers pay enough attention to, or even know about, including even some professionals...but it is a must.

Why? Well, the answer becomes obvious when the winning (or losing) records of certain professionals are considered. Here are just a couple of ex-

amples. One excellent (now former) PBA pro is Kelly Coffman. An outstanding bowler in many ways, and highly intelligent, Coffman, who did some cashing on tour and made the TV show several times, never won a tournament. In the opinion of some top coaches, the reason for this was because he consistently put too many revs on his ball for his ball speed. In other words, revs and speed did not match!

"How can this be?" you may

ask. The answer is simple. As many of you may know, the rev rates of professionals are recorded in r.p.m.s (revolutions per minute). The average PBA touring pro is in a range somewhere between 425 and 475 r.p.m.s. Their ball speeds are somewhere in the range of 18 to 21 miles per hour, which breaks down to somewhere between approximately 15 to21 revs from release to impact. It turns out that Kelly Coffman generated more revs than anyone else on tour at the time...about 600 rpms...while increase ball speed or slow down his ball speed, somewhere in the the revs. normal range, was too slow for that high revving ball. So his revs and ball speed didn't match. That, according to some experts, made it difficult for him to control the ball's hook. So his ball generated too many revs to keep it from over-hooking. Coffman, a highly intelligent man, went on to design bowling balls for a major manu-

facturer. Therefore, it certainly wasn't stupidity that caused the problem. Since I never met Mr. Coffman, I can merely state what has been reported, but that's the story as I've heard it.

A Greater Success Story The highly successful PBA champion, Robert Smith, on the other hand, often generates even more revs that Coffman...over 650 r.p.m.s on many of his shots, according to reports.

So how can Smith win, when Coffman couldn't? Simple... Smith is capable of throwing the ball faster than any pro on tour...often in the range of 27 plus m.p.h. on many shots... which simply means that Smith is successfully matching ball speed to revs, thus generating acceptable ball control on the lanes. (I've timed Smith at nearly 30 mph, but that was on a straight spare shot.)

Smith formerly controlled his rev rate by having often used what is called a Sarge Easter drilled ball. This is a ball the great bowler of the past, Sarge Easter, often used...drilled fingertip for the middle finger, but conventional for the ring finger. Since the ring finger is normally considered to be the revving finger, this slows the rev rate when needed. If you watch recordings of some of Smith's past tournaments carefully, you'll notice he used this type of ball much of the time.

Last year however, I noticed that Smith has "softened" his hand somewhat during the release. When I mentioned this to him during a tournament, he acknowledged that this is helping him control his revs more effectively, thus allowing him to go back to a normal fingertip ball. Smith has won some prestigious tournaments since then.

My friend Palmer Fallgren, a PBA champion of some years ago, as well as Team USA's former head coach, was the tour's statistician for some time. While I'm sure others were aware of the importance of rev/ speed ball matching, Fallgren was the first to write about it in the pages of Bowling This Month magazine, a few years ago

### **Checking Your Own Rev Rate**

Buy some one inch wide white tape at the drug store. Put about a 4" strip of it on your ball at an angle just above the ring finger hole, as shown in the illustrations. Then throw your strike shot a few times and count the revs of the tape from release to pocket impact (or have a friend count them). If your rev count is anywhere from around 13, 14 to about 19, you are matched. If it is less than 13, you need to add revs (see last month's issue) or slow down your ball speed. If your rev count is 20 or more, you need to either

overturning. Result? At the finish, the hand is in a "knuckles up" position and the arm has "chicken winged"! That scenario creates several problems. 1) an overturned (spun) ball, 2) a weak ball, 3) a pulled shot and 4) inconsistency.

Had enough?

Here's how to fix it: When starting your downswing, come down by leading with the last two fingers of your hand, all the way to the release point! This allows your hand to stay behind the ball long enough so it won't turn too early. Remember, you want the ball to turn on the lane, not in your hand.

Then, as you release the ball, turn your hand only enough to bring the thumb up to 12 o'clock. Turning the thumb around any farther is the common trouble, which seems almost impossible to avoid for most bowlers.

But there's an answer, and here it is: I call it "Hitch-Hiking"

What you do, is this: At the very end of your follow through motion, imagine you are trying to hitch a ride on the highway. You know what I mean, snap vour thumb toward about one o'clock or so (left handers toward about 11 o'clock, as if you were hitching a ride in England.)

This works, as long as you don't do it too early during the swing. Remember...at the end of the follow through. Do it too early and you'll kill the hook. It may take a bit of practice, but it works, because this way, if you do overturn your hand a bit, you can recover...and throw a much more powerful strike ball!

### 2 - Pocket Spotting

The art of watching the ball's behavior at the pocket is of extreme importance. Watch to see at what angle the ball hits the pocket. Why? Because without enough "entry angle", the ball over deflects off the head pin and a standing ten pin is the result (7 pin for left handers). So...watching the ball at the pocket is critical.

If you notice your ball hitting the pocket too flat, it may mean that you didn't put enough hook action onto the ball during your release. Or, it may be you are throwing the ball too close to the middle of the lane, where there's too much oil to allow the ball to hook (remember, oil is like ice...the ball won't hook where the lane is slippery). So, since there's less oil near the gutters, vour answer might be to put you mark somewhere between the first and second arrows, where it is drier and the ball will hook more.

If you adjust your mark, you'll also have to adjust your feet in the same direction somewhat. How much, you'll have to figure out during the next shot or two, of course. Anyway, watching the ball at the pocket is the answer to discovering

This is probably the second most common problem bowlers have during the last part of the swing...the follow through!

It begins during the release, where over 90% of bowlers turn the hand too early! This, then, results in the hand and forearm

many problems, which are usually easy to fix, once you do it. Too many bowlers watch the pins, which is a beginner's mistake.

So...watch the ball, then the pocket!
