"50 years of Women's Professional Bowling" Exhibit to Open in 2011 During Bowl Expo and USBC Convention

ARLINGTION—The new International Bowling Museum and Hall of Fame is proud to announce that it will be adding a new exhibit to the museum which pays tribute to the history of women's professional bowling. The exhibit will be unveiled during the International Bowl Expo and USBC Convention, which will be held, in Arlington, TX during the last week in June 2011.

"We are so excited about Bowl Expo, as well as the USBC convention, coming to Texas. Those who attend this first-ever-event will get a firsthand look at the IBM/HF, International Research and Test Center, as well as the offices that comprise the International Bowling Campus," stated IBM/HF chairman Pat Ciniello. He went on to add that the exhibit will display rare photographs and artifacts - from those who made professional women's bowling a reality, to the great women bowlers who competed on tour.

A committee has been formed to develop the contents of the exhibit, as well as to raise funds in order to build it. Jim Goodwin, President of the Bowling News Network and publisher of Stars & Strikes Bowling Newsmagazine. has been named chairman. Goodwin worked with the Ladies Pro Bowlers Tour and the Professional Women's Bowling Association for 20 years. Public Relations expert Joan Romeo, owner of The Marketing Team agency, will be handling the fund-raising and promotions aspect of the project.

Joan's two daughters, Robin and Tori, are former pro tour players. Robin is in the PWBA and USBC Halls of Fame.

Former LPBT & PWBA Tour Director and Historian Fran Deken will be an invaluable member of the team in recording the history and making sure all the right people are honored: and former PWBA owner and museum trustee John Sommer, who operated and financed the LPBT and PWBA for 22 years from 1981-2003, will contribute his time, effort, and expertise to the project. Deken and Sommer are also members of the PWBA and USBC Halls of Fame.

ESPN Pro Bowling Kicks Off November 28

NORWALK-Due to declining participation, last year the California USBC injected \$17,000 into the Queen's and Master's Tournaments in hopes it would attract a crowd and with the threat of abolishing both tournaments if it didn't work.

Bowlers who participate in the Queens were asked to comment and the bottom line was: Location (although we know it is more financially prudent to have it close to the state tournaments for staffing reasons); No one wants to qualify at one time and have to come back for the finals (in this case a trip for the So. Cal gals to Northern California twice.) Few liked the format and increased fees were a factor and there were numerous changes. The original format was simple and effective and you know what happens when you fix something that ain't broke. It also appears no one cared what

the bowlers thought.

Old format: All Queen's events on one weekend - you can bowl your tournament events (or not,) qualify and if you qualify - go into double elimination - winners and losers brackets. If you make the finals they are held on Monday - usually Memorial Day weekend which seemed to work well for most. Entry fee was one amount with late entry another and there was a buy in fee to take the place of a no-show. Sponsors supported the tournament and there were monetary prizes for High Qualifier, High Game, etc. The previous year's Queen was seeded. Associations often sent their local tournament All Events winner. The tournament was promoted by sending entry forms to those who bowled in the two previous years and entries were available through the local association offices or continued on page 11

UPLAND—In our long awaited return to Upland Bowl, bowlers came out for a semi tough shot this week. Despite the many happenings elsewhere and mainly the big Pacquio fight we still had a decent total of 131 entries this week. The people enjoyed the hospitality of the friendly Center . Cut scores were a + 70 for the men and +38 for the women. This week, our three Super Seniors added to the board were William Parks (+51) and Walter White (+49) for the men and Joyce Charles (+25) for the women. That would give us a total of 48 bowlers making it to the semi-finals this week for what would also be the finals as it was a Beat the Board semi-finals.

For all qualifying squads our top qualifier for the Men was White Hot Rodney Payne with a +203, and for the women it was Deborah Sanders with a +100. Each will get paid entries into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed overall draws the Match Series, and this week it was worth \$1050. The top seed drew a 511 but we had no one that bowled that score. This week at Bowlium Lanes we will estimate the Match Series at \$1550. For the 3-6-9 qualifying this week, there were not a lot that qualified for the roll-off, but those that did saw Ryan Nam be the last person standing to go for the

\$2000 pot. He missed on his first shot and received a \$50 consolation. We will add another \$100 at Bowlium Lanes for total of \$2100.

In the doubles this week, we had 96 groups get into the doubles, with 17 spots being paid out. The top prize this week went to LeStar Walker and Rodney Payne with a 1527 for \$120. In 2nd place it was Rodney Payne and Stan Por with a 1518 for \$100. The low to cash was 1421 and we paid out \$960 in doubles.

This week we had a different format, as we would not have match play finals due to Upland Bowls very popular Cosmic Bowling that started at 9 pm. The final standings were determined after the three games at semis. After the first game, the leader was George Covarrubias (last weeks winner) with a +72 and close behind him was Bohner San Pedro with a +67. The fifth place score after game 1 was a +54, so it was real close after the first game. During the 2nd game we would see changes in the top and it get closer still. There was a mere 9 pins separation between our top 6 bowlers, with 7th place only 13 pins behind our leader. The 2nd game leader was Aaron Hodges with a tie for 2nd between Chris Moore and JJ Soon at +85. At +83 were Stan Por, Bohner San Pedro and David Jones. We

would see the 3rd game come down to the end to decide who would be this weeks champion. Aaron finished first and set the stage for a close finish by Chris Moore. Chris would need to punch out in the 10th frame to over take Aaron but fell short, and Aaron Hodges first place finish with a 761 score getting \$1000 for first plus \$1700 in cash and carry, Chris Moore in 2nd with a 742 for \$500 and 3rd place finisher was Stan Por with a 730 getting \$200. In 4th and 5th place with a 718 were Andrew Toro and Jemerald (JJ) Soon getting \$110. As a reminder we do guarantee 3 women in the top 16, so 15th and 16th saw Kerry Lucka and Franki Matush. It was close battle in the final game to see who would win this week.

Our top seed/ Hodges had the honor of drawing the match game worth \$1900 and drew a 256. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had no one that shot that score, so it will carry-over to next week and we will estimate the pot at \$3500 at Bowlium Lanes. This week we had 6 new bowlers join us, and no returning member. Let's welcome these new bowlers to the club, Jayakomar Jayarajan, Mike Scimone, Marcus Battiest, Kelley Bendt, Joseph Kaiser and Angela Smith, and we would see 2 of the new bowlers make the semi-finals in their first time
