# **Forces Barnes To Drop Out Of USBC** Masters

GREENDALE, Wis.-In his professional career, Chris Barnes of Flower Mound, Texas, has never withdrawn from an event after taking to the lanes. On Wednesday, he made the tough decision to end his run in the United States Bowling Congress Masters.

Barnes, a six-time winner on the Denny's PBA Tour and the spokesperson for USBC Sport Bowling, came into the week with a back injury and as the tournament progressed it slowly got to the point where he could no longer compete.

"I don't really know exactly how it started," Barnes said. "I had some pain when I got here Sunday. I practiced three times that day to try and work it out. I went and worked out, did my exercises and normally that makes it go away."

When the pain didn't go away, Barnes tried to continue but games of 233 and 164 Wednesday he decided to call it quits. He started the day in 234th place at 987.

"It's disappointing because I take great pride in my record in the Masters," he said. "I don't think there's ever a good time for this to happen, but I certainly wouldn't want it to happen this week. But I take solace in the fact that my wife is kicking butt halfway around the world. I'll ride the wave that she's created.'

Barnes, whose wife Lynda currently leads the QubicaAMF World Cup in Ljubljana, Slovenia, will take some time to evaluate his injury and determine the next course of action.

Duke, looking for his third career major title, struck on five straight shots, including a double in the 10th, forcing Scroggins to mark. The left-hander responded by converting the 6-pin in the 10th to clinch his first career major win on Tour.

"Sometimes it's harder to get a mark (in the 10th) rather than having to strike on your first shot," said Scroggins (Amarillo, Texas). "Sometimes you get up there and get tentative...you need to throw an aggressive shot.'

Duke, who entered the day as the top seed and lone righthander in the stepladder finals, had averaged 240.66 in 36 previous title match appearances.

Abakumoff, Riverside had high scratch series of 985 from games of 260-278-213-234 along with 16 handicap received \$425.00 for 2nd place because the event drew only 21 entries on account of its high \$105.00 entry fee. But the event allowed a re-entry at \$15.00 if you trash your first score.

Yoma received \$220.00 for third and the woman Roles \$165.00 for 4th. Another San Diegan Stephen Sinatra took 5th place \$125.00 with his 925 (246-192-175-188 plus 124). The last 6th place \$91.00 went to Jack Sickinger, Long Beach for his (692 plus 228) 920.

Honorable mention went to a young entrant, Kevin Sepma, La Puente for his tournament high game 288 in his 800 series but his total with handicap 864 was out of money.

Along with John Sherwood's 635 and sub Joe Weiss' 780 (180-177-231-192) who subbed for Jim Mohr, Jones' S F Valley scored 505-541-567-599 for its high 2212 total. Weiss subbed for absent Jim Mohr. Valley beat 2nd place Riverside (2076) 16.5 to 3.5 and moved back to 2nd place. Ed Abakumoff shot 216-205/745 and Robert Audette 211/737 for Riverside.

League leader South Bay retained first place with 17.5 points win over Hollywood whose star bowler Dan Flores was absent with illness. Connie Marchione led South Bay with 203/735, Pablo Yoma 713 and Don Millwee 213/708 in South Bay's 2156 which also broke the old season high series.

# Sanicolas Wins First ABTA Title At Forest All Pots Carry Over This Week • 3-6-9 is \$1,800 \$6,000 1st In Big Thanksgiving Event This Week

LAKE FOREST-San Diego bowlers were shining at Forest Lanes. But none as much as Randy Sanicolas who won his first ABTA title in a stellar performance winning from the top seeded spot and downing fellow San Diegan, pretty Leny Uruttia in the title game that went to the final ball in a 192/203-171/201 margin and a nice \$2,000. Randy was buying the beer :\_)

Leading the Semis was Randy at a fine +143. He would sit out to bowl for the title with fellow San Diegan Jim Smith at +111 in second place who would sit out in round one of the single elims and enter in round two. It took a +53 men and+19 for the guaranteed ladies to make the Sweet Sixteen single elims.

The bowlers took to the lanes. In the first round single elims, losers were, Jo Jo Lamando, Dave Dittlinger, Anthony Borci, Gerry Hingco, Vic Garcia, Dominic Tambio, and K. C. Wolfe. They got checks of \$100 in 10-16th places.

In round two being eliminated were Carl Bailey, Jerry Ernst, Hai Le, and Kristy Yahiku. They cashed in 6-9th places and \$105.00 each.

Round three had Leny

Uruttia down Leo "Horses" Tartamella in a shootout 253-235. Ping Romero took out Jim Smith 262-188. Jim and Leo were 4th and 5th with fine bowling, and \$110 each, with Leny and Ping to meet for the chance to bowl Sanicolas for the title.

Leny was at her best, and downed a very tough competitor. Ping in a great match in a 218-212 win. Ping was third at Forest and \$200. Leny was off to the title game vs fellow San Diegan Randy Sanicolas.

The title game was on and Randy elected to lead off. He did with a big split. Leny opened also and after four frames Leny led by 20, but Randy tossed a turkey in frames 4-6 to take a lead. Leny got spared til frame 9, strike. With another in the 10th, would take the lead but got a big 3-7-10 split and miraculously picked it up. This would force Randy to mark for the win. # A Day Late and a Dollar Short

The late, great Bob Summerville was born in October. Since this was intended as a birthday recognition, I should have gotten it in last month. But I didn't forget him. I did mention some of the things which made him so important to bowling, as part of my October article.

Actually, there are several additional items Summerville should be recognized for. One is the abiding interest he had in helping increase bowling's continually declining league membership numbers, which run in the millions

This subject is more than important...it is critical...to the future success of bowling.

I bring this up because recently, USOC president Roger Dalkin, in the fall issue of the US Bowler, offered up his ideas. "Coaching is the key" is a quote from that article. In this context, President Dalkin refers especially to increasing the availability of coaching for high school and college students, as well as other youths.

I wholeheartedly agree with this concept. Any opportunity to increase an interest in our sport among the youth of America can have nothing but long term positive effects.

I might mention however, that there a number of additional points Mr. Dalkin didn't mention. Several others agree with me. For instance, Frank Kietz, a long recognized expert and writer about bowling, was recently published in a number of bowling newspapers on this subject.

Kietz writes (and I'm paraphrasing), that if coaching were the key, the millions of league bowlers we have lost would still be bowling, filling the numerous centers which have recently closed. To this I add that today there are more certified coaches than ever before. So where are the league bowlers?

Where does Bob Summeville fit into this picture? After all, isn't he the one who came up with the concept for "Bowling This Month" magazine, a publication dedicated to coaching and instruction?"

True. However, Summerville knew that if BTM became successful, then at least the number of serious league and tournament bowlers would increase, instead of being lost along with the "social" league bowlers. The figures prove him right.

I mention this because in some of our talks, his stated opinion was that the key would be to recognize that the majority of league bowlers are social bowlers, who do it for fun. Most wouldn't take lessons, even if they were free. In fact, free coaching has been offered by at least one big center chain, with few takers.

So they started birthday parties for kids, colored light bowling with loud music, which does bring in money. With this I agree. If kids get used to coming into a center, maybe they'll keep coming when they grow up.

However, Summerville's ideas ran along similar lines to those of Kietz...ideas such as paid marketeers, more volunteers, courteous, friendly and knowledgeable counter people, phone numbers of eligible bowlers from past league average books, association and proprietor cooperation such as league bowler discounts, prize/trip league formations, advertising, etc.

Here I can report a small but successfully growing beginning. At least one major corporation is doing well with some of Sumerville's and Kietz's ideas. They are actually building and filling new centers with such tactics, as well as buying up centers and rebuilding league attendance in the above mentioned way. Of 31 centers in our fifth largest city, the busiest center has been and is continuing to successfully use these tactics...much more so than coaching.

The result? Increased league membership.

Congratulations, Bob Summerville and Frank Kietz! Your ideas are proving to be true.
