### 55th Annual Bowling Writing Competition Now Accepting Entries

GREENDALE, Wis. — The United States Bowling Congress is now accepting entries for the 55th annual U.S. Bowler Writing Competition. The competition will award \$3,800 in cash prizes to winners in editorial, feature and news categories.

Deadline for submitting entries for the contest, sponsored by USBC's official membership magazine, is Jan. 31. Eligible entries must have been published between Jan. 1, 2006 and Dec. 31, 2006.

#### 2006 UNITED STATES BOWLER WRITING COMPETITION RULES

1. Deadline for entering the 2006 US Bowler Writing Competition is Jan. 31, 2007.

2. Editorial, Feature and News stories must have been published or broadcast between Jan. 1, 2006 and Dec. 31, 2006. Entries must be original clippings with broadcast entries accepted on tape or CD. Materials that appeared in US Bowler or US Youth Bowler are ineligible.

3. Entry guidelines for the three categories are:

a. EDITORIAL - Any opinion expressed in the media concerning a tenpin bowling related subject.

b. FEATURE - A non-fiction story concerning any individual, facility, equipment or organization related to tenpin bowling involvement.

c. NEWS - A tenpin bowling related story written under deadline with proof of following day publication.

4. First place in each division will carry a \$300 award. In addition to the first place awards, others will be: News and Editorial - \$225, \$200, \$175, \$150, \$75, and \$50; Feature - \$225, \$200, \$175, \$150, \$125, \$100, \$75, \$50 and \$50. There also will be five honorable mention cer tificates awarded in each category 5.Entries should be unmounted, clearly identified as to author as well as name and date of publication. Author's name. mailing address and social security number must be included with the entry. Entries will not be returned. 6. Entries are limited to three per author in each division.

Malott was nearly perfect for the second time in his career on TV, striking with his first eight shots before leaving a 10-pin in the 9th frame. Last season, he shot 299 in the semifinals en route to his first career title in the 2005 Mile High Classic. A strike with his first ball in the 10th frame clinched the win over Barnes, the eighth consecutive top-seed to fall in stepladder finals.

The third-seeded Malott advanced to the finals with a 239-177 win over second-seed Mike Scroggins. Malott struck in six of the first eight frames while Scroggins opened three times in that span.

Malott first defeated the fourth seed and PBA Hall of Famer Bohn, 268-246, finishing the match with eight consecutive strikes.

In the first match, Bohn defeated fifth-seed Jack Jurek, 268-225, striking with his first seven shots.

Malott earned \$25,000 and an exemption for the 2007-08 season, while Barnes (Flower Mound, Texas) took home \$13,000 for second. Scroggins (Amarillo, Texas) earned \$6,500 for third, Bohn (Jackson, N.J.) earned \$5,500 for fourth and Jurek (Lackawanna, N.Y.) took home \$5,000 for fifth.

### **USBC'S Registered Volunteer Program Serves** As Model For Other Youth Organizations U. S. Olympic Committee Adopts Background Check System Developed by NCYS and NCSI

GREENDALE, Wis.-The goal to protect our nation's young athletes from sexual predators received a major boost recently when the United States Olympic Committee revealed details of its new background screening procedure for team leaders, coaches and additional officials involved in the 2007 Pan American Games.

The USOC is requiring its sports' national governing bodies to utilize the services of the National Center for Safety Initiatives (NCSI), the Cleveland-based screening organization owned and governed in partnership with the National Council of Youth Sports (NCYS)

Earlier this year, the United States Bowling Congress (a charter member organization of the NCYS) and the NCSI tested and began a national roll-out of USBC's Registered Volunteer Program, which was designed to serve as a model for other interested organizations dedicated to preventing abuse of their young athletes and program participants.

"We have been working with the NCYS and NCSI to implement national standards to protect youth participants and volunteers, regardless of the type of sport or social activity," said USBC Chief Executive Officer Roger Dalkin.

"Having the USOC adopt the 'red light/green light' background check system developed by the NCYS and NCSI and used in USBC's Registered Volunteer Program means we've taken the next big step to meeting our goal. I sincerely hope that other youth sports organizations and youth membership groups will join us in our efforts to protect children and teens from abuse."

The "red light/green light" background check system provides vital results information while maintaining the privacy of individuals being screened.

## **USBC Continued:**

#### by John Jowdy

Several months ago, the USBC issued a newsletter regarding the Refocus On System Of Bowling Research....Bowling Balls, Bowling Pins, Lane Conditioning, and Lane Surfaces.

In a previous column, I addressed the areas of bowling balls and bowling pins. However, I experience great difficulty in expressing my views on out-of-control areas of Lane Maintenance and Lane Surfaces, as presented by the USBC newsletter dated 9-18-06.

In addressing Lane Conditioning, the USBC goes into detail regarding oil application of lane conditioners, which is the liquid applied to wood and synthetic lanes. USBC experts explain the two purposes of lane oil:

1. To protect the bowling surface and

2. Affect the difficulty level of the game, depending on how it is applied.

Currently, the USBC is working to develop a device that measures the amount and location of friction on a lane. Serious bowlers know that friction between a bowling ball and the lane surface dictates how much the ball will hook. This is not a startling revelation. The application of oil on lanes has long been the source of fictitious scores that have made a mockery of the game.

I would like to sensibly address lane maintenance procedures and surfaces but it would be an exercise in futility. The recent USBC press release of record-shattering scores indicate no slow-down of fake, ultra-phony, ridiculous bowling scores that continue to be accepted by the USBC. In addition to these unfathomable scores that have degraded, and distorted our game, our governing body PROUDLY sends out press releases to glorify these "lane doctored" records.

A USBC News release, dated, 9/28/06 listed the following recordbreakers among the 2005-06 season:

1.On March 19, a women's team posted a 3-game series of 3610. This represents an average of over 240 per bowler.

2.during the 2005-06 season, a three-man team shot two-300's and a 297 to set a one-game record of 897. Folks, this is an average of 299 per bowler.

3. All other records were mixed teams; those with men and women competing together. On April 7, a five-player team of three women and two men, shot 1305...a "mere" 261 average per bowler.

4. That game helped this team to post a 3625 total, the highest ever for a three-women/two men team series. This averages out to a 725 series per player or a 241 average per bowler.

5. On October 3, 2005, a three- women/one man team shot 1,048, meaning this four-person group averaged a "paltry" 262 per bowler.

6. During the 2005-06 season, a team from Wisconsin consisting of four women and one man set a team game record 1126. This figures out to a 225 average per bowler by one man and FOUR women !

How can I, in all honesty, not respond to such absurdity? When does it stop? Where does it end?

Sports-minded readers ask, "how do amateur bowlers outscore and out-average professionals?" Can anyone blame sports editors for considering bowling primarily as a recreation?

Why do I take such umbrage, displeasure, and bitterness at the direction our game is going? Why? Simply stated, I'd like to see bowling accepted principally as a SPORT, not a recreation. I'd like to see bowling ranked among other individual sports such as golf, racing, tennis, and track. I'd like to see our bowling professionals recognized as athletes. I 'd like to see major bowling events recognized in the sports pages of American newspapers.

I have no problem with bowling being classified as a recreation. However, I am violently opposed to rewarding recreational bowlers with national notoriety and sacred records.

So what's the answer? I strongly recommend that any new records ONLY be awarded on Sport Bowling Conditions or in competitions that meet USBC standards. This is, by no means, meant that record bowling scores performed on recreational conditions be ignored. Nonetheless, instead of being rewarded with rings, plaques or medals, recreational bowlers should be complimented with certificates designating the nature and classification of their feats.

Several years ago, bowling hailed the consolidation of the ABC, WIBC, and YABA under the banner of the United States Bowling Congress. I sincerely hoped that USBC would assume a greater role in restoring integrity to bowling. But alas, nothing has changed. As a matter of fact, the only meaningful rule change by the USBC is, "it will no longer issue its "High Score " awards for scores rolled during unopposed bowling sessions before or after regularly scheduled league play.

Woefully, this rule change was prompted by the acceptance of teenager Robert Mushtare's questionable two (he reported three but one was rejected) 900 three-game series that stirred up the greatest scoring controversy in bowling history. Unfortunately, it was too late.

Hopefully, there is still time to take drastic steps to curb the nonsensical scoring madness... despite the severity of the possible consequences.

## HIGHEST SERIES, AVERAGES FOR 2005-06 HONORED BY USBC 900 standard sets, 814 in Sport Bowling among highlights

GREENDALE, Wis.—Four 900 series in standard play and an 800 series in Sport Bowling competition highlighted the high series award category for the United States Bowling Congress in the 2005-06 season. High season average honors also were awarded.

The 900 series were rolled by Lonnie Billiter Jr. in the Bergeron Memorial League at Fairfield (Ohio) Lanes and Mark Wukoman in the Saturday Night Men's Special League at Classic Lanes in Greenfield, Wis., in adult competition and by youth bowler Robert Mushtare, who had two perfect sets in the Pine Plains Bowling Center Junior/ Senior League in Fort Drum, N.Y.

Sarah Jones topped adult females in standard competition with an 860 series in the Rebel Rousers League at Collins Bowling Center/Eastland in Lexington, Ky., while Kelly Groff had the best female youth high series with 837 in the Saturday 9:00 AM Mixed Juniors League at Blue Ball Lanes in Lancaster, Pa.

Michael Jacobs led all Sport Bowling participants with an 814 series in the Hawthorne Lanes Sport Bowling League in Vernon Hills, Ill. Caroline Lagrange had the high set for adult females with 792 in the Greater Wichita (Kan.) Sport Bowling League at Thunderbird Bowl. Brett Shepherd led male youth Sport Bowling participants with a 751 series in the Thursday Youth Sport League at AMF Derby Lanes in Louisville, Ky., while Michelle Carcagente of Orlando, Fla., had the high for female youth with 709 at the USBC Intercollegiate Singles Championships at Olympic Lanes in Milwaukee.

High average honors awarded in standard, Sport Bowling competition USBC also announced those bowlers with the highest season league averages. Mushtare was the leader for male youth with a 242 average for 78 games in the Pine Plains Bowling Center Junior/Senior League. In the adult male category, Chris Lucas had the third best average in history with his 253 for 69 games in the Amazing Racers League at Jersey Jerry's Bowl in Bonesteel, S.D. Tammy Jones and Julie Hall shared the high average award for adult females with 237 - Jones for 85 games in the All-Star Individual Classic at King Pin Lanes in Springfield, Ill., and Hall for 96 games in the State Street Queens League at State Lanes in Saginaw, Mich. Jennifer Reyes had the highest average for female youth with 224 for 128 games in the Lefevere's Family Bowl Siv-Kost Junior Scholarship League in Saginaw, Mich. Mark London topped all Sport Bowling competitors with a 225 average for 48 games in the Tuesday Sport Scratch Trio League at Brunswick Deer Park Lanes in Lake Zurich, Ill. Former Team USA member Kristal Scott led adult females with a 201 average for 96 games in the Greater Wichita Sport League at Thunderbird Bowl. Ryan Van Hecke led youth bowlers with a 205 average for 48 games in the Dan Ottman Summer Sport League at Sunnybrook Lanes in Sterling Heights, Mich., while Ashly Galante successfully defended her female youth national high average honor at 200 for 90 games in the Scott Russell Junior Gold Sport League at Countryside Lanes in Clearwater, Fla. ## Engelbrecht is ABTA Thanksgiving Winner at Covina - Wins \$3,775 & Tops 525 Entrants

COVINA—John Englebrecht an on and off long time member did it up big time as he won the ABTA Thanksgiving Special at Covina Bowl with a stupendous performance!

This event was held over three days, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. A nice turnout of 525 entrants trying their game and enjoying the fun, camaraderie, and competition.

The scoring was tough but very fair, as we had lanes dressed as close to the same time daily as you could have. Thursdays cuts had Men +36, Ladies +26, Friday night, near the same Men +37, Ladies +25 and Saturday saw Men +32, Ladies +1. The final Re-entry squad had scores of Men +32 and ladies -1 make the grade. Super Seniors added to the board were, Darwin Balding, Paul Passarino, and Cliff Higgins . Ladies Angie Nillo, & Bobbie Mc Collum, and a fine field of 110 made the semifinals.

Round #4 saw Ace Chelsea get aced losing in another tie match roll off to Chris Kelly in a 9-10 frame roll off at 215 each. In a match of two of our pretty ladies, Janice Meloon edged Seoul Kim 202-197. Seul and Ace were 4th, and 5th with great bowling and \$300 each, with Janice and Chris to meet for the right to bowl for the title against John Engelbrecht.

## National Deaf Bowling News A 7 Pin Denies Malucci A Perfect Game at La Habra 300 Bowl

LA HABRA-On Tuesday night November 16 in Frank's Gold Cup League at La Habra 300 Bowl after rolling a 214 in first game, the deaf bowler's premier 300 shooter Carl Malucci strung 11 strikes in row in his 2nd game. His 12th ball went in the pocket just like the others but a 7 pin refused to fall. The Whittier lefthander finished third game with a 267 for his second 780 series. That 299 second game is Malucci's career 12th. Two weeks prior in this same league Malucci hit front 10 in row but ended up with 287 and a 778 series. Also after winning the National Deaf Master Bowlers Championship at the Orleans in Las Vegas on October 1 Malucci had a 278 in his first 780 in that La Habra league. While that was not his best league series this season, Malucci shot a 280 and 781 in his other league, Angel West Deaf League at Anaheim Concourse Bowl. In that NDMBA tournament at Las Vegas, Malucci battled head to head with Detroit deaf pro Pete Kaczmarczyk in 2nd block of qualifying round, setting a tournament record 790 for first 3 games (254-279-257) and finished with a 740 for a tournament record 1530 for 6 games. Not wanting to grab all the spotlight, Malucci noted that Daniel Vasquez, Jr who also bowled in the same league with him at La Habra Bowl had a near miss also a short time ago, rolling front 10 strikes in row for a 287 game in a 737 series. In ending Malucci added a classic understandment, (they are) "All near misses but there's no if, could, or but in bowling. Sometimes you get 'em and sometimes you don't, right?

## USBC Modifies Rules Regarding Accetable Awards For Youth

GREENDALE, Wis.-The United States Bowling Congress Board of Directors has approved the modification of Youth Membership Eligibility Rule 400, effective immediately, to expand the awards deemed acceptable under the terms of USBC Youth membership. In addition to previously allowed symbolic awards, USBC Youth members are now eligible to be awarded bowling equipment, gift certificates, apparel and other merchandise prizes with a total value not greater than \$500 in any one event, excluding scholarships.

The modifications also allow for USBC Youth members to compete in singles competition where cash and/or bonds are awarded, as well as merchandise prizes exceeding \$500 in total in any one event, but must waive rights to these awards by signing and completing the USBC Prize Waiver form prior to their participation in that competition.

Acceptance of awards of cash or bonds of any amount or any merchandise prizes with a total value higher than \$500 per event remain prohibited for youth members under USBC's revised Rule 400. Violations of the terms of Rule 400 could result in the loss or suspension of youth membership.

There also remains no limit on the value of scholarships that can be awarded in youth competition. The scholarship funds from USBC certified events and leagues will continue to be required to be deposited with USBC's SMART program. USBC Youth members may be awarded scholarships from singles competition in which cash and/or bonds are awarded.

The USBC Board determined that the former Rule 400 placed unnecessary restrictions on everyone associated with USBC Youth membership and concluded the best course of action to alleviate this issue was to modify Rule 400 effective immediately,USBC President Michael Carroll said.

The previous version of Rule 400 intended to protect the current and future interscholastic sports eligibility of USBC Youth members through the most restrictive interpretations and limitations. The USBC Board concluded that placing these restrictions on all USBC Youth members was unnecessary due to the lack of uniform eligibility standards for interscholastic sports nationally.

The new structure of USBC allows for addressing of significant issues to be handled in an expedited manner said USBC Chief Executive Officer Roger Dalkin. The previous version of Rule 400 placed undue and unintended restrictions on USBC Youth members, league and association coordinators and proprietors. The USBC Board modified Rule 400 to address hese restrictions and expand acceptable awards that promote and enhance the participation in youth bowling. The USBC Board concluded that compliance with local/state interscholastic eligibility rules and policies is the responsibility of the individual member and his/her legal guardian. However, USBC will continue to educate USBC Youth members and their legal guardians that competing in USBC certified competitions and acceptance of some awards now acceptable under Rule 400 could jeopardize individual member interscholastic sports amateur eligibility.
