of Pflugerville, Texas, capped a three-match sweep in the finals of the Professional Bowlers Association Cheetah Championship, defeating top qualifier Parker Bohn III of Jackson, N.J., in the title match of the historic ESPN telecast, 243-169, for his ninth career PBA Tour title.

The first of seven telecasts from PBA World Series of Bowling V at South Point Hotel, Casino and Bowling Center aired Sunday on ESPN, and featured the use of a highlyvisible blue oil on the lanes for the first time in PBA history.

Malott, in winning his second consecutive title, defeated Colombia native Clara Guerrero, 214-208, in the opening match, and was nearly perfect in ousting 51-year-old PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., 288-242, in advancing to the title match.

Guerrero, only the third woman ever to advance to the nationally-televised championship round of a PBA Tour event, made a short-lived, but

exciting appearance. The 31lost both times. He commityear-old former Wichita State ted a foul that contributed to University star - now married a 235-228 loss to Johnson in the 2005 PBA Banquet Open and an American citizen living not far from Malott in Pfluger-(the first time a woman had ever appeared on a PBA Tour ville - took a 15-pin lead over Malott into the eighth frame of telecast), and in July, after he the opening match. But Malott won the U.S. Open in Columfinished with a string of five bus, Ohio, Malott lost a special strikes to eliminate Guerrero, "Battle of the Sexes" match 214-208, and exorcise a peragainst Johnson, the Women's U.S. Open winner, 194-188.

"There was a lot riding on this show, especially for me," Malott said. "The first match against Clara - the lady - I obviously remembered my foul against Liz and losing to Liz at

the U.S. Open. I needed to get that off my back. As much as I acted like it wasn't there, it was on the back of my mind. I told myself at the end of the match I couldn't give up and let it happen again, so I wanted to put the pressure on her and I was fortunate to come out the winner.'

For Guerrero, just the opportunity "was a dream," she said. "Every time you see the guys on TV, you want to compete with them, beat them. So being here, having the opportunity to bowl against the greatest bowlers in the world, it was a dream. It was the best part of my career.'

After closing out Guerrero with his string of five strikes, Malott added another 10 in a row against Weber, losing his shot at a perfect game when he left a 10 pin on his 11th shot.

"That might have been the best shot I threw all day,' Malott said of the 11th shot. "I'd throw that one again a million times.

He continued his torrid pace, striking on seven of his first eight shots in racing away continued on page 4

If you're still looking for a Christmas gift or any occasion gift for that bowler on your list the king is still a bowling ball.

A bowling ball used to be a lifetime object with a similar guarantee. It was often passed on to relatives, friends and other bowlers. Seldom was it tossed away and still rates high in the things stored away in closets, garages, attics and basements.

Bowling balls don't last as long as they used to but they still last close to forever. The compositions are softer and wear easier but everything is relative. Pros change bowling balls as much as they change socks and might use a ball for a few games or a few months and in very rare cases, a few years. But a pro bowls as many games in a week as the average bowler tosses in a year.

Long before it became common for bowlers to have more than a handy bowling ball or two, hall of famer Bob Strampe was way ahead of the norm.

"If pro bowlers could carry them, they would have a different ball for every lane." said Strampe.

Today's pros and high averagers, most of them experts on bowling balls and grips, their own, and every ball arising from the experience and imagination of those who devote their lives to come up with the perfect bowling ball, will search forever.

Most bowlers have more modest goals, a ball that's comfortable and heps them improve their game a bit.

All approved bowling balls are fine, but they are all different, within United States Bowling Congress specifications. The outer surfaces vary in hardness, as does the composition, inner weight blocks, balance, total weight and color.

You don't have to know the plus and minus factors of every ball, but in buying a ball you should seek the advice of someone who knows or can determine what is best for you. It is not rocket science; it is bowling science.

The weight of a ball is all important and it is no backward step to go to a lighter ball, and many of the top pros do not use the maximum weight of 16 pounds. Color of the ball is the bowler's choice and these days there are as many colors for bowling balls as there are for Christmas tree balls or Easter eggs.

Make arrangements for a bowling ball gift with a certificate or a blank ball that can be changed later when the bowler has a chance to spend some time with the seller.

And with all the many scientific and technical advances in bowling balls, Teata Semiz, all time great, makes no excuses for his feeling for each new bowling ball.

"Many times I didn't change much at all, but a new ball gives you a new outlook and a new mental lift that can't be matched, " said Semiz.

Isn't that what gifts are all about?

from Bohn in the title match.

"Against Pete, both of us are kind of in the running for player of the year, and I thought I would help my chances by winning that match," Malott said, "but I also had to beat Parker to win the title, so every match meant a lot. I just worried about myself and did what I could to win back-to-back titles (the Cheetah Championship was the first PBA Tour event since the U.S. Open), and it's a great feeling."

The Cheetah Championship was the first time a lane conditioning oil with a color additive had ever been used in a PBA Tour championship event, and it was praised by both Guerrero and Malott.

"I saw it," Guerrero said. "I thought it was going to be a little different. I thought I'd see the lines on the bowling ball, but it didn't bother me at all. I think it's cool for the audience to actually see the oil and understand the game a little more, but I just ignored it."

Malott agreed.

"Everyone was concerned about what the dye was going to do to the oil, but I really didn't move for all three games," he said. "Because I bowled all three games playing the same line, so you could see the track of the ball. That's what I was curious about.

"This oil could be very educating for the fans and outsiders to help them understand what we're dealing with, and to see how accurate we are," he added. "To me that's more important than what the oil did to us. I don't think it affected anything performance-wise. I'm kind of excited about it."

The "blue oil" will be used in all four animal pattern championship finals held during the World Series. The Viper Championship presented by PBA Bowling Challenge will air next Sunday, Dec. 8, followed by the Chameleon Championship on Dec. 15 and the Scorpion Championship on Dec. 22. All December telecasts begin at 10 a.m.

The Cheetah Championship telecast also included the first of four special "PBA League Challenge" segments, allowing the eight PBA League franchise players to demonstrate their skills in unique competitions. The first segment was a "blind bowling" event in which a large curtain was suspended over the lanes, hiding the pins from the players and leaving only the first part of the lanes visible for targeting. Each player bowled a ninth and 10th frame, and Weber – the franchise player for the PBA League New York City WTT KingPins – won the initial round of "challenge" competition by throwing four strikes for a perfect score of 60.

In the light-hearted competition, BROOKLYN STyLES franchise player Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., asked for a re-rack (despite not being able to see the pins) and competitors jokingly complained that Dallas Strikers franchise player Norm Duke had an unfair advantage because he's so short, he could see under curtain.

After winning the round, Weber said, "I didn't have to shoot any spares, so what's the big deal? I spot at the foul line, so shooting spares wouldn't have been a problem if I had needed to shoot at one. I never even saw the screen."

Next Sunday's Viper Championship telecast will include a "speed bowling" PBA League Challenge, calling for players to roll as many strikes as possible in a span of 90 seconds.

Carol: Steve, last week you were talking about a certification class that taught bad technique. I'm having a hard time wrapping my head around that.

Steve: I'm sorry, but it's true. It wasn't intentional; it was tradition.

Carol: You said the "universal truths" of bowling helped you understand the weaknesses of the old ways.

### Steve: That's right.

Carol: In honor of that......I think I'd like to burn you at the stake for heresy! I liked the old ways! Dean: I've got some scraps of paper here.....and I could probably come up with some old pins!

Steve: I didn't mean anything other than this: What I was taught didn't work; how the pros bowled did.

Carol: True, but not everyone can bowl like a pro!

Steve: Why not? The same basic principles that make the pros successful can make any bowler more successful. If that's heresy.....

Carol: DEAN! PUT THAT STAKE AWAY!

Dean: But .....

Carol: Steve has a point. My old mentor used to say, "There are two ways to get good; practice a lot.....or practice doing things the right way." Then she'd wink and say, "Someday, you're going to be real good!" I hate to admit it, but Steve's right. NOW, PUT THOSE MATCHES DOWN! Dean: Rats.

Carol: Steve, you win. For the sake of our readers who haven't read your book, what are the universal truths of bowling and why are they important?

Steve: The first is: Bowling is a game of skill, not power. Watching many of today's pros gives the impression that bowling is all about power, but that's an illusion. Accuracy and consistency comes first for them; it needs to come first for you also. That's important to understand because delivering a ball powerfully, into a gutter, scores NOTHING! That is true for everyone. Carol: Well said.

Steve: The second is: What you do determines what the ball does. The ball doesn't have a mind of its own. You are the only thing responsible for where the ball ends its journey. That's important because it explains why you must learn, understand, and practice an EFFECTIVE delivery rather than making lame excuses. That is also true for everyone.

Carol: I'm going to miss hearing all those excuses. They sell a lot of towels!

Steve: The third universal truth is: The ball travels a line to it's target. That line is unique to every bowler. It begins in the stance and ends at the pin(s). Again, that is true for everyone. To become a respectable bowler, you must learn to get the ball on that line and keep it there during each step of your delivery. A bowler who doesn't follow this rule is doomed to a career of inconsistency.

Carol: Is that it? There's only three of them?

Steve: My original list had eleven.

Carol: Eleven?! What happened to the others?

Steve: I really don't remember. They probably just didn't apply equally to grandmothers, kids, left-handers, you know, they just weren't truly universal. Don't get me wrong, I'm not saying there's only three, but they're the only ones I could come up with that applied to bowling technique. Remember, I try to keep things simple.

Carol: Because ....

Carol/Steve: "THE SIMPLER SOMETHING IS, THE BETTER IT WORKS."

Carol: That was good. We make a pretty good team. How about if I let you buy me an iced tea? Steve: I wish I could afford it.

Carol: Okay, how about this? Next week I'll let you explain how those truths apply to technique? Steve: It's a deal. Wait a minute! I thought you wanted to get this interview over with.

Carol: I do. I hate doing interviews......[but I have a paper to fill, "Pushover"].

## **Hannah Diem Becomes Youngest to Roll 300 Game**

FLORIDA Hannah Diem of Seminole, Fla., became the youngest United States Bowling Congress member to roll a certified 300 game November 17th when she ended her Youth/Adult Fall league session at Liberty Lanes in Largo, Fla., with 12 consecutive strikes.

At 9 years, 6 months and 19 days, Hannah broke the previous overall record of 10 years, 2 months. Hannah started the night with games of 204 and 226 before rolling the perfect game to finish with a 730 series, a personal best by 166 pins. Entering the night, her high game was 224 and her high set was 564.

"Going into the third game, I knew what she needed for her first 600 series, but then the strikes started to add up," said Heidi Diem, Hannah's mother. "It's like every shot she threw was right there. It was magical." Diem credits much of her daughter's continuing improvement to the support and guidance of the older youth bowlers at Liberty Lanes and the dedication of USBC Bronze coach James Crouch, who runs the youth program and the Youth/Adult league. Hannah also spent time over the summer at the Kegel Training Center in Lake Wales, Fla. In four years of certified competition, Hannah has raised her average to 162. She bowls in multiple leagues each week, practices often and bowls in tournaments on the weekend. In 2012, she won her singles division at the Florida State Youth Tournament. After her second game Sunday night, Hannah asked her mother when she thought she'd roll her first perfect game. The answer was, "next year."

"I tried not to talk to her too much and distract her," Heidi Diem said. "I don't know how she composed herself. I've never thrown a 300 or been close, so I don't know the pressure she felt when she



was up there. Going into the 10th frame, it's like she didn't waiver at all. She just got up there and nailed it." For Hannah, the accomplishment is a little bit overwhelming. "At first, I wasn't that confident I could do it, but as I got more strikes, I felt like maybe it could happen," said Hannah, who uses a 12- pound ball. "This just feels amazing. It's so much excitement, and my brain is still trying to process it all." Hannah hopes to continue improving with the help of her teammates and coaches, and her sights are set on potentially competing in the Bowling.com Youth Open Championships and USBC Junior Gold Championships in the Buffalo, N.Y., area next summer. For now, she and her mother are enjoying the chance to bowl together on Sunday nights. "She certainly didn't get the bowling gene from me," Diem said. "I always joke that it skipped me, and she got double, but it means a lot that it's something we can do together."
