

## Chris Barnes & Missy Parkin Kick Off 2012-13 PBA Season with World Bowling Tour Titles Two-year international journey ends with victories during PBA World Series of Bowling IV



LAS VEGAS – Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, and Missy Parkin of Lake Forest, Calif., successfully concluded two years of international travel when they captured Bayer Advanced Aspirin World Bowling Tour men's and women's finals titles to kick off the 2012-13 Professional Bowlers Association television season at South Point Hotel and Casino.

Barnes, a 14-time PBA Tour champion, defeated reigning WBT men's champion Mika Koivuniemi of Finland, 244-228, while Parkin defeated Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, N.Y., 238-190, in the women's finals during the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling. Both finals, which featured three players who qualified by

Barnes, who won the Columbia 300 Vienna Open in Austria in October to lock up his berth in the WBT men's finals, edged Mike Fagan of Dallas, 258-244, in the semifinal match before closing with a string of six strikes for a come-from-behind victory over his close friend, Koivuniemi, in the title match.

"Any win feels good," Barnes said. "Mika and I always have good matches. I've been fortunate the last three times, but I'm pretty sure it'll even out whether I like it or not."

The key to Barnes' victory was three 10 pins left by his long-time international rival on the right lane in the third, seventh and ninth frames.

"I left a couple of solid 10s on that lane myself," Barnes said. "I knew that lane was tighter. I threw one shot that I thought was pretty good that didn't even get back to the pocket."

Forced to finish his game on the tricky right lane after Koivuniemi's misfortune in the ninth frame gave him an opening, Barnes made a critical adjustment and threw three strikes in the 10th frame. The first strike was the one that iced the title.

"I knew I was going to move right and have to stay firm with the shot," Barnes said. "Earlier on in my career I didn't commit to that shot very well, but I committed to it, and made the shot I wanted to throw. It didn't quite get up to high flush, but it was good enough today."

As part of their ongoing rivalry on television, Barnes and Koivuniemi make a side bet that has involved things like the gaudy Madras plaid pair of pants Koivuniemi was forced to wear on television the last

time he lost. "We had a jersey bet on this one," Barnes said of his WBT win. "I, or my fans, or his daughters will get to design a jersey that he'll get to wear on a future TV show. And pretty *continued on page 8*

## Bowling Tips by Robert Ellison

Hello bowlers! Hope all of you had a great feast - it has been awhile since I've last wrote up bowling tips.

Todays topic is how keep your bowling balls clean. Bowling balls are important part of the game. Once you've invested in a top-of-the-line bowling balls- its essential keep balls cleaned and maintained. By maintaining your balls - they should last for a long time.

Think of bowling balls like a sponges- sponges absorb water and you "squeeze" out the sponse to get the water out of the sponge. Same applies for bowling balls- the ball "absorbs" the oil on the lane- and its important to "squeeze" out the oil from the ball.

When the bowling ball rolls down the lane- other things happen. The ball picks up oil, lane conditioner, and dirt. Once the ball absorbs oil, conditioner, and dirt; the bowling ball looses traction. Thus, the ball surface smoothes out and the ball has less traction (and less effective these balls will react on the lanes).

After you throw each shot- its important to wipe out the oil on the ball. This will keep oil from "absorbing" oil/conditioner/dirt on the ball. Microfiber towel works best in cleaning bowling ball after each shot. This is a special absorbent towel for cleaning bowling ball.

For optimal results in maintaing/cleaning your balls, you can either do this yourself with ball spinner at home, or bring the balls to the pro shop. You can purchase the ball cleaner thru your local pro shop or on-line bowling website.

The pro shop have the proper cleaners, and skills, to clean balls more thorough. By cleaning the ball, this can regain some of its performance (key word- SOME of the performance- as the ball has been used during the game and already "absorbed" the oil in the ball).

Keep in mind- you cannot use ball surface cleaners WHILE bowling in league or tournament play. You can clean balls prior or after each league or tournament play.

There are 4 stages in bowling ball maintenance: 1. After each frame surface cleaning (microfiber towel); 2. After bowling session surface cleaning; 3. Periodic surface rejuvenation; and 4. Deep cleaning or grit cleaning.

Its wise to keep your balls clean and properly maintained- so you can get more (and longer) use out of the balls. Cleaning your ball is not difficult, and with the knowledge and care, your bowling ball can continue to provide you great performance for years to come.

Keep in mind that most of what I am talking about is for newer high performance bowling ballsas plastic bowling balls only periodic cleaning as they do not absorb oil/conditioner/dirt as often as high performance balls. Plastic calls maybe polish every 100 games.

## The Essentials of Bowling **Approaching the Perfect Game**

Incase you missed it the first time.. This is the 2nd edition

#### CHAPTER 6 The Release

The importance of the *release* is obvious; it launches your shot down the lane. Not so obvious, but equally important, is *what your* release tells you. If the ball comes off your hand smoothly, it is saying that you performed the prior skills properly, that your wrist was well positioned, that your timing was good, and that you have made a good shot. If the release goes poorly, it is telling you that you made a mistake at some point in your delivery.

This is the skill that gives your game that personal touch—liter-ally. Muscle power is allowed here, because it can be applied beneficially, without too much concern for inconsistency.

Now it's time to learn how to take your best shot.

#### Technique

Initiate the release. Your arm is swinging forward. The instant it reaches vertical, relax your grip on the ball by removing the pressure your thumb is exerting on it. Concentrate on feeling the weight of the ball shift onto your fingers.

Apply lift. With the thumb now free of the ball, maintain the rigid posture of your wrist as much as possible. Focus on accelerating your *hand* along the target line, using the strength of your fingers to loft the ball out onto the lane (lift and loft are synonymous).

TIP Like the other skills, a consistent release happens in your mind first. The ball should not be allowed to simply pull itself free of your grip. Flip a coin like a referee at a football game. Notice that the thumb moves and the fingers don't. This action is identical to how a bowling ball is released. To ensure a consistent and reliable release, mentally picture yourself flipping a coin out onto the lanes.

*TIP* Wearing a wrist support is *highly* recommended. It will help prevent the wrist from flexing during the release. This keeps the fingers in the ball longer, allowing them to impart more rotation to the ball. It also allows you to feel what your wrist is doing during the armswing (when you can't see it). Finally, note that tremendous forces affect the wrist during the entire delivery. Wrist supports greatly reduce the severity of repetitive stress injuries that bowlers are prone to suffer.

TIP After the ball has left your hand, pose at the foul line until the ball has passed over its target. This ensures the consistency of your whole delivery. It also allows you to study the line the ball travels and look for changing lane conditions. If you can't maintain your balance, you have delivered the ball too aggressively. You will be inconsistent, and unable to observe or adjust to changes in the lane conditions.

#### Discussion

Let's take a quick look at the two elements that make up a consistent release so that you will understand how to perform and adjust this final skill.

Initiating the release: The release terminates the forward portion of the armswing. It happens in the blink of an eye, so you don't have the luxury of time to think about it, unless as instructed, you have been focused on this *exact* instant since the end of the backswing. This point is actually determined for you when your arm is straight up and down, because that is when the ball is exerting its greatest force against your grip.

Take advantage of the laws of physics by just going along with what nature is telling you to do anyway; let the ball roll off your thumb. When the thumb releases its pressure, you feel the weight of the ball shift onto your fingers. This happens both quickly and automatically. It is called the explosion point because it is where you may apply your strength to explode out of the ball.

Loft the ball: If you choose to apply power, now is the time, be-cause only the muscles in your fingers will be involved and they aren't powerful enough to significantly alter the path of your shot. They are, however, extremely consistent. Employing them at this point provides your ball with additional rotation. This makes the ball hook more and mix the pins up more effectively when it strikes them.

TIP For the sake of your consistency, think all or nothing when deciding whether to apply power as you loft the ball onto the lane. Anything else promotes variations in the ball's path.

While simply letting go of the ball may sound like the easiest thing in the world, it is not. It must be done with such precise consistency and relies on so many other conditions that it is a challenging skill to perfect. These conditions include:

#### CHAPTER 7

Making Spares The secret of a 200 average is to become proficient at making spares. To put the importance of spare making into perspective, con-sider this: The highest possible score in a game with *no* spares (or strikes) is 90. The highest possible score in an all-spare game is 190. Knocking down just 10 more pins makes a difference of 100 pins in the final score. Shoot just two or three strikes in a row and Bam! You have a 200 game.

Making spares is easy once you have zeroed in on the pocket. Spot bowling (using the arrows on the lane as your targets) is the key. This aiming system operates on the theory that a target 15 feet away is easier to hit than a target 60 feet away. Once you have established where to stand and which target to hit in order to put the ball in the pocket, follow this rule of thumb:

*Right-handers*: For every pin to the right of the pocket, move your stance three boards to the left. For every pin to the left of the pocket, move your stance four boards to the right. Do not change your target.

Left-handers: For every pin to the left of the pocket, move your stance three boards to the right. For every pin to the right of the pocket, move your stance four boards to the left. Do not change your target.

This generalization can be applied to combination spares as well as single-pin spares. The trick is to think of combinations of pins as single-pin spares. For example, to make a 5-7 split, a right-hander should aim for the nine pin. A ball heading for the nine pin (which isn't even there) is very likely to graze the five pin and send it toward the seven pin. Get the idea?

The exception to the rule is the ten pin for right-handers and the seven pin for left-handers. There is much less room for error when shooting these spares because they bring the gutters into play. Avoiding the gutter is paramount because once the ball enters one, it is out of play. If it jumps back out, any pins it knocks down do not count. To avoid the gutter, consider the following:

To make the ten pin spare, a righty should move the stance as far to the left as possible and use the area around the middle arrow as the target. This keeps the target line away from the ditch longer. It also causes the ball to hook less because there is always more lane conditioning oil in the middle of the lane.

To make the seven pin spare, a lefty should move the stance as far to the right as possible and use the area between the third and fourth arrows as a target (left-handers tend to have more natural hook to their shots).

TIP Two common combinations are almost impossible to make. These are the 4-6 and the 7-10 splits. When faced with them, make sure that you knock down one of the pins. Do not try to make the spare. The precision necessary is beyond human capabilities. Getting one pin has three positive consequences:

A pin hit by a ball will give you a chance of actually making the spare by bouncing around a bit. This is where luck becomes important. A missed pin will just stand there until it is removed by the weep, costing you and your team pin count.

Games are won and lost by that one pin. You want to be the bowler that wins by a single pin. (Encourage your opponents to try to make these spares).

Staying calm and continuing to perform establishes you as a bowler, not a hothead.

While the best scratch bowlers in the Citrus Belt's southern tier struggle to score, the chatter in the crowd is about the old days when the value of a spare was greater than the value of a strike. If you want to score when strikes are sparse, you better make your spares. That was the way it was in the old days. "WHEN STRIKES ARE RARE, SPARES ARE GOLD."

When was the last time you heard bowling fans speak of someone being a great spare shooter? I don't remember any such talk this century.

While La Riviere is a great spare shooter, he took a week off from the rigors of rolling two balls every frame. Instead, he became only the second bowler this season, in Cal Oak's 640 Scratch Trio League, to roll at least thirty strikes in one series and score 800. His 805 (268 - 300 - 237) is second high to RAY WINKOWSKI'S 811.

All these physical elements must come together perfectly for a smooth release that produces a consistent and devastating shot. Practicing the skills as described and purchasing quality equipment help ensure that happens. However, there is one more element to consider in the development of your release. It is intangible but may be the most important part of your game. It is your confidence.

This is the mental element that is the secret to ensuring that your release is successful over and over again. Lack of confidence is what makes you believe that you must steer the ball. It prevents you from trusting yourself and giving up control of the ball, hanging on to it beyond that explosion point. This leads to shots that are pulled off the target line, which leads to bad scores, which causes a lack of confidence, which leads to more poor shots, which leads to . . . well, you get the idea. It's a vicious cycle.

Learning and practicing good technique breaks that cycle. It is much easier to unleash your shot when you know, without a doubt, that your stance, pushaway, and armswing have your ball on the target line. Understand that the techniques you have mastered will make the ball roll over its target again and again. Rest assured that it will hit the pins with more than enough power to make mincemeat of them. Once you do, you will look forward to the release because you will enjoy watching the show. That's what confidence is all about.

The release is the worst possible moment for something to go wrong. Practice your skills, trust yourself, turn that ball loose with confidence, and enjoy the successes you will have earned.

## **Steelers Linebacker** LaMarr Woodley Becomes **Fifth PBA League Owner**

SEATTLE - All-Pro Pittsburgh Steelers linebacker LaMarr Woodley has become the fifth team owner in the new PBA League, the Professional Bowlers Association announced today.

Woodley, currently in his sixth season in the NFL with the Steelers, joins Los Angeles Clippers star guard Chris Paul, former Super Bowl champion Pittsburgh Steelers running back Jerome Bettis, former NFL all-pro receiver Terrell Owens and actor/comedian Kevin Hart as owners in the PBA League which debuts as part of the PBA Detroit Winter Swing Jan. 19-27 at Thunderbowl Lanes in the Detroit suburb of Allen Park, Mich.

"Bowling is a personal pastime for me," said Woodley, a native of Saginaw, Mich. "I grew up bowling in my hometown of Saginaw and now I go with my teammates and friends in Pittsburgh. I was introduced to the PBA when I played in Chris Paul's charity event and got a firsthand look at how incredibly talented these athletes are, and I couldn't be more excited to be a celebrity owner in the first ever PBA League.

Woodley will be owner of the Pittsburgh Jack Rabbits which is made up of franchise player Osku Palermaa, Martin Larsen, former Saginaw Valley State All-American Dan MacLelland, Thomas Larsen, Patrick Allen and supplemental pick Anthony LaCaze.

Woodley was a member of the 2008 Steelers' Super Bowl championship team and was also an All-American and Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year at the University of Michigan before being drafted by the Steelers in 2007.

"LaMarr is a proven winner and we are glad to have him on our side," said PBA Commissioner Tom Clark. "There are some natural rivalries within the PBA League forming fast, including LaMarr's Pittsburgh team and Jerome Bettis' Motown squad. Plus, who in their right mind will dare make the ridiculous statement 'bowling isn't a sport' to Mr. Woodley?

Woodley is also active in many charitable initiatives. The LaMarr Woodley Foundation - www.lamarrwoodleyfoundation. com - is a non-profit organization designed to give underprivileged and underserved youth and adults an opportunity to overcome unfortunate situations and their environment.

The eight teams that will make up the PBA League were determined through a draft that was conducted during the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling in November.

ESPN will televise five weeks of PBA League competition beginning Sunday, Jan. 27, plus the PBA League Elias Cup finals in April. The celebrity owners will not compete on the lanes as part of official PBA League competition.

During the first four days of the Detroit Winter Swing, the PBA will conduct a series of open-field tournaments (the Carmen Salvino Classic, Mark Roth Classic, Don Carter Classic and Earl Anthony Players Championship). Those four events will award individual PBA Tour titles and the qualifying scores posted by each PBAL team member will be combined to produce the team qualifying scores for the ESPN telecasts. All PBAL matches on ESPN will be Baker Format matches, where each team member will bowl two frames in each game.

## PBA Announces 2013 PBA50 Tour Schedule

SEATTLE (Dec. 5, 2012) – A new name, new venues, a season-long points competition leading to an ESPN-televised finale and a crop of new star players will highlight the 2013 PBA50 Tour season, the Professional Bowlers Association announced today.

The 2013 PBA50 Tour (formerly PBA Senior Tour) schedule will consist of 11 tournaments with new stops in Welch, Minn., Tampa, Fla. (tentative), and Trussville, Ala.

The season-long point competition will qualify the top three players for the ESPN-televised PBA50 Tour Finals which will be a stepladder event conducted during the 2013 PBA World Series of Bowling V next November. Also, selected PBA50 Tour events will be webcast live on pba.com's Online Bowling Channel Xtra Frame. Details regarding the televised finals and Xtra Frame schedule will be announced later.

"We are thrilled to be bringing a PBA50 final back to TV," said PBA Commissioner Tom Clark. "A national audience will see first-hand that the competition on the PBA50 Tour is intense, important and the crop of players eligible will excite all bowling fans. The PBA is committed to its over-50 membership and proud to be bringing the best of the best to a national television audience."

The PBA50 Tour will also include other changes including a revised format advancing more players to match play in selected events that attract 120 or more entries.

The Super Senior prize fund – for the age 60-and-older players who finish out of the regular prize list – will also be revised. In previous years, Super Senior cash spots were awarded based on total entries. For 2013, cash spots will be awarded at a ratio of 1:6 Super Senior entries, with a minimum of eight and a maximum of 10 cashing in each tournament.

Las Vegas will continue to host the PBA50 Tour's two major championships with the Suncoast Hotel, Casino and Bowling Center hosting the Suncoast Senior U.S. Open presented by Storm June 2-7 followed by the United States Bowling Congress Senior Masters at the South Point Hotel, Casino and Bowling Center June 9-14.

The 2013 PBA50 season will again see a new crop of toplevel players from the PBA Tour eligible to compete, including PBA Hall of Famers Pete Weber, Parker Bohn III and ESPN PBA Tour analyst Randy Pedersen. Also on the list of those becoming eligible at age 50 in the months ahead will be PBA Tour champions Jack Jurek, Chris Warren and David Traber.

In the women's finals, Johnson advanced to the title match after a thrilling 267-260 victory over PBA Tour titlist Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J. But Johnson's strike shot evaporated in the title match. A 4-6-7 split in the second frame and a 4-6 in the fourth put her in a hole she couldn't escape.

"I've come in second a lot lately," said Parkin, who lost to Chicago's Diandra Asbaty in the Australian Masters title match prior to the WSOB and finished second to Kulick in the U.S. Women's Open earlier in the year. "Today I wasn't going to let that happen again. I kind of went out with a mindset that I was going to make the pins strike. I know you can't do that, but it was the mindset I had.

"I only had one game, and I needed to throw 10 really good shots, and I feel like I did. Luckily the pins fell my way and it was enough to win.'

But for Parkin, the victory made her international travels worth the effort.

"This year all of the travel has been particularly hard being away from family and friends," she said. "It's really hard; a lot of people don't understand how much we travel. Winning this tournament after two years and having to accumulate all those points means so much."

The second annual Bayer Advanced Aspirin WBT Finals presented by the PBA also signaled the start of a new points cycle for the international series. #### **IDLE BOWLING THOUGHTS**

..You can't count the number of disagreements with judges and other officials during the Olympics. That is simply because many are judgement calls by experts in their sports who have a lot of leeway. No such problems in bowling 99 percent of the time. The basic rules cover personal equipment and all areas involving the playing equipment. And they are accepted around the world.

"I'd rather be lucky than good" is a phrase you may have heard many times. You may have uttered it yourself. But can't mean it, or shouldn't believe it. Luck is fine in its place, in the proper perspective.

But you can't practice or learn all about luck, and therefore you can't perfect it. That makes luck a fitting and fleeting intangible.

Don't get me wrong. Luck can and does cause a high undeserved game and it may be present for an entire night or throughout a tournament. Luck, in the right place, can produce an incredible game or night or performance. And one lucky shot in the right place might determine a title.

It has often been noted that all the good breaks and bad breaks even out over the long run, though there are few bowlers who feel they will ever get even. But don't ever confuse luck with certain areas of skill such as an overworking hook ball or a dangerous angle akin to the gutter shot or an almost impossible angle.

All the high numbers, averages, money earnings, titles and super credentials were not erected by bricks of luck. Stars of any era would rather be good than lucky and are so much the better for it.

So will you

William Edward Staub of New Jersey died recently at age 96. He enjoyed a long list of activities such as building and flying radio controlled airplances, water skiing, golf and near the top was bowling and he was an enthusiastic participant and bowling center owner.

He also headed a number of companies and excelled in the exercise and aerobics field. Staub received a lifetime achievement award from Health and Fitness magazine.

He was considered the most influential figure in the development and manufacturing of the home treadmill.

...The most important statistic to any pro bowler is earnings per tournament. The bottom line is how much money you spend to win prize money. Every sport is a challenge and in professional sports, such as bowling, golf, track, rodeo, tennis, horseshoe pitching and many others that pay prizes to contestants but little in the way of guaranteed fees and salaries are the real gut grabbers. Your living is on the line and it is very difficult to play for pay and not be paid to play.

.. The late Bruce Pluckhahn, ace writer and public relations genius for bowling once pointed out that if you look at attendance figures for sports they often seem staggering. But if you count league and tournament bowlers who roll 30 weeks or more and the thousands of tournament participants the guaranteed at-tendance figures for bowlers could be 100 million.
