The Perfect Game

The Perfect Coach: Part 9

What is self-coaching? It's the mental part of your game; the ability to use your knowledge of technique to fix problems you are having posting decent scores. The key to doing so effectively is to understand that high scores happen when your delivery matches the demands of the lane condition. Thus far, we have only described, in very specific terms, how to perform the basic skills* which create the accuracy bowling requires. If that was all any bowler needed to know, coaches wouldn't be necessary, but the fact is, lane conditions change, and as they do, so must you. That's referred to as "adjusting" and it's time to learn a bit about that.

As you are now well aware, your approach consists of five basic skills*. If you suspect that these can all be compromised, you are absolutely correct. When it happens accidentally it's a flaw, but when it's done intentionally, that's adjusting. Adjusting done well is called, "Good coaching!" Let's get started.

- Modifying the stance: Many scoring problems can be cured with simple adjustments to this skill.
- Moving the placement of your stance is the most common adjustment in this sport. This is done to make spares, and to compensate for changes to an existing oil pattern. Moving the stance left and aiming for the same target moves your ball's trajectory to the right; moving it right and aiming for the same target takes the ball more to the left of the pins.
- Moving both the stance and the target changes the "line" being played. Try this when you are hitting the pocket, but leaving corner-pins.
- Holding the ball higher in the stance uses gravity to reliably generate more ball speed. Holding the ball lower in the stance slows the ball (for the same reason).
- Modifying the push-away:
- ball-speed by raising or lowering the height at which you terminatethis skill.
- Trying to modify the arm-swing is unwise for casual league bowlers. Attempting to do so while self-coaching may do more harm than good. This skill commences at the termination of the push-away and ends at the point of release. Since the release-point is a constant, let the height of the push-away be the only change you make to this trouble-maker. Here's a tip: If you have questions about your arm-swing, have a friend take a video of it. An iPad is great for this purpose. Watching such a video allows you to study the efficacy of your swing and greatly enhances your ability to visualize future performances.
- Modifying the release:
- This is another skill that is best left alone. The release must occur at a precise moment with a wrist that is properly positioned at that moment. For that reason alone, you must focus on a release that is CONSISTANT. Tinkering with it will only impede your progress
- Modifying your walk: The walk should carry the ball along the target-line, but most bowlers drift as a result of swinging a heavy ball from one side. It is more important that the walk be consistent so the release-point along the target-line is consistent. This is another skill best left alone. The leg muscles are the strongest in your body, so they are already consistent. Adjusting your walk is a highly advanced skill best left to elite and professional bowlers (you'll get there).
- These represent only the preliminaries of what elite bowlers know, but it's a good start**. Before you begin putting this new information to use, a few precautions must be mentioned:
- Do not adjust anything because of a bad shot. Consider making a change only after making a series of at least three bad shots.
- Never adjust more than one skill at a time.
- Any adjustments should not adversely affect accuracy. In other words, no matter how you modify your delivery, the priority must always be to keep the ball on the all-important target-line.
- When things go well on one lane but badly on the other, adjust only on that bad alley; like snowflakes, two lanes are rarely identical.
- * Until now, we haven't discussed the walk. The leg muscles are the strongest in your body so your gait will already be consistent. Modifying it is highly advanced, so, unless you can afford professional instruction, leave it alone.
- ** This information represents only the most elementary adjustments/explanations. For more professional-level information, I highly recommend, "Bowling Execution," by John Jowdy.

Watching Football, Thinking Bowling

Did you happen to watch the Monday night football game between the Cincinnati Bengals and Pittsburgh Steelers?

It was vicious, vicious, vicious, a lot of cheap shots and some hard-to-watch, stomach-churning injuries.

It made me thankful to know that my competition comes within the safety of a bowling center instead of on the gridiron.

It also reminded me about a bowling-football intersect – a football player who I enjoyed watching long ago and happened to be tagged with a bowling moniker.

Anyone remember Charlie Tolar and his absolutely fitting nickname?

Tolar was a running back drafted out of Northwestern State of Natchitoches, La., in 1959 by the Steelers. After being cut by Pittsburgh, Tolar became a top performer and all-star with the Houston Oilers of the American Football League.

Tolar, a three-year AFL all-star, played with the Oilers alongside legendary quarterback George Blanda; Heisman Trophy winner Billy Cannon; and wide receiver Charlie Hennigan, also a Northwestern State alumnus. The Oilers won the AFL's first two championships (1960, 1961) behind this assortment of stars.

Tolar's nickname?

He was the **"Human Bowling Ball."** And never was there a better moniker.

Tolar was 5-foot-6, 210, and fearless, and he typically got lost behind his offensive line before plowing into the defensive middle.

"The defensive players couldn't see him about half the time because he ran so low to the ground," said Bud Adams, the founder of the Oilers.

After scrimmaging against Tolar, Oiler teammate Dalva Allen said: *"It's like trying to tackle a bowling ball."*

Added Bob Talamini, a former Oiler: "The only thing Charlie didn't have was breakaway speed, but he'd run through a brick wall to get one yard."

That was Charlie Tolar, a man of short stature but big heart, who died in 2003 at 65.

Wonder if he ever bowled?

• CHIP PETTIFORD, Junor star at **MIDTOWN BOWL**, thrilled the spectators with a 300 game. Wasn't the last one, was it CHIP?

• CANYON LANES in Saugus announced a December openng.

• Mechanics at the SHOWBOAT rode bicycles to catch the machine calls in the 72 laner.

• I love words that start with B. Bowling & Bowlers are 2 of my favorites. O.K. O.K. Let's add balls and Brunswick!

• ALHAMBRA VALLEY BOWL hosted a tournament for bowling center desk people only! Seventy-nine desk persons followed directions and had some fun.

• JACK MONAGHAN had two pet rabbits, one named DUSTIN HOPMAN and the other RABBIT REDFORD. (Not history breaking, just funny.)

• JACK EDLER was called "Bowling's Master Teacher" associated with U.S. Bowling Academy Pro Shop.

• The first tournament for the A.B.T.A. was held in December, (BOB LOMAX was in charge - - BOB SMITH took over a short time later.)

• The great MARGE BRADFORD was President of the W.W.P.B. Every bowler had style and talent, the elite lane ladies.

• The most legendary duo was the NAGY's STAN and EILEEN. In 1977 they hosted the 32nd Annual Washington's Birthday Singles Classic at **CORONA BOWL**.

• TIGER RECREATION CENTERS had 11 lanes to brag about, (and staff, and pay for, and bring in the customers) EAGLE ROCK, AZTEC, GAREY CENTER, BEVERLY BOWL, SANTANA, SOUTH BAY, SANTA FE, HIGHLAND, MIDTOWN, MONTEREY PARK and LUCKY LANES.

• The Bowling News had subscribers in Finland, Canada and Mexico. (In 2017 the Bowling News is E-MAILED to 78,000 U.S. bowlers plus a few thousand in 13 foreign counries every week.) Locally about 3,000 open their E-MAIL and read the paper every Tuesday.

• Coming soon **TUSTIN LANES**. 42 lanes would be ready for fall leagues. (I never heard anyone praise the place — or the staff, or the condition's or scoring.)

• The KTT Tournament Clubs held contests in LOS ANGELES, SAN DIEGO, SAN FRAN-CISCO, SAN BERNARDINO, RIVERSIDE and OAKLAND. For a \$10.00 membership, you could bowl any tournament, any where, any time. KTT ads, stories and results took up four pages every week.

• Well, well, well. DON CECIL leap-frogged to **COLUMBIA BOWL** in March, 1977. His Day League Co-ordinator was the very able PEGGY BEAUCHAMP.

• ED HARTNETT was one of the best Association Secretary's at the time. Men took care of the male bowlers and women took care of female bowlers, from the ABC/WIBC down.

• LANDMARK BOWL ran a 10 gamer. The winner was GIP LENTINE, second CASEY BEASLY and WARREN NELSON third. Mustaches were in!

• Western Columbia Pro Shop introducted the "KOKKI-LOKKI" elbow lock.

• Remember C. Sanders Emblems? They made all the wonderful association piins, comic pins and pens we traded with other bowlers at Nationals and Coventions. I'll bet you have a box full somewhere!

• Bowlers were complaining about the price of a sanction card - - - \$3.50. But they sure wanted help when a secretary ran off with the prize money! It got so bad centers were forced to bank league money.

• Cal State Men's Assn.' sent out 9,301 checks to pay off tournament for 1977.

• Champion swimmer MARK SPITZ took up bowling and had LON MARSHALL drill a ball for him. JOE KRAJEIK drilled a ball for DUSTIN HOFFMAN.

• MISSION HILLS BOWL and CANOGA PARK BOWL had baseball teams, complete with cheerleaders. The competition was fierce! MATADOR BOWL had their Manglers.

• ROY ROGERS was B.V.L. Chairman. Also owned a bowling center and museum in Apple Valley.

• Every center had a sign reading "Get In Out of the Smog - Go Bowling." Remember when you had to have your car lights on - in the daytime - to drive on the freeway?

• MARK BAKER was a Junior All-Star. Whatever happened to him? My spies spotted him in Vegas.

• BAR TULANIAN rolled the first KTT 300 game for a big \$277.00 Jackpot. BAR - BAR - BAR!

• A Cleveland proprietor built a "Bowling Pin Car". 'Twas a convertible that held 4 passengers.

• The best selling Christmas gift for a bowler was the LT-48 Ball.

• KEN LOWMAN, owner of Bowling News, was a bassonist. He wrote music at Disney Studios for hundreds of Popeye cartoons.

• GARY TROSEN rolled the first 300 at **COLUMBIA BOWL.** MIKE DI CIOLLA was manager. TROSEN used a LT-48! MIKE was a rodeo champ.

• CHICK HEARN ("Bowling For Dollars") signed a contract to televise 26 shows from **GRAND CENTRAL BOWL** in Glendale.

Jeff Stitz Swims With the Sharks – and a Perfecto Surfaces

WINNETKA – It's easy to get intimidated in bowling.

Compete against players with 200-plus averages and a resume filled with honors scores and it can be difficult to maintain focus and rhythm.

Of course, sometimes bowlers raise their level of play when confronted with talented opposition.

Such was the case with Jeff Stitz.

With the opposing team sporting such intimidating dynamos as Johnnie Englehart (240 average), Craig Kisro (233) and Karl Kurtz (221), Stitz didn't flinch during play in the Mixed Classic Handicap Bowling League at Winnetka Bowl last week.

"Bowling against a team like that with all their 300s and 800s. I knew I had to step up my game," Stitz said.

Step it up he did.

Undaunted by his talented opposing cast, the righthanded Stitz blasted his first perfect game, part of a 709 series (300-188-221).

"They were all so nice," the 54-year-old Stitz said about his opponents. "We had a lot of camaraderie. Even though they were the

opposing team, they were cheering me on."

Stitz finished his gem with a flourish, throwing three pocket strikes in the 10th frame. On his final shots, he appeared extremely calm and collected. almost indifferent.

But that was hardly the case

"Actually, my feet felt like jello and I was just hoping I didn't fall flat on my face," said Stitz, who bowls in two leagues - at Winnetka Bowl and Corbin Bowl in Tarzana.

Stitz's previous high was 289, which he rolled a month ago at Corbin Bowl. He started that game with 10 strikes before leaving a "solid nine" on his 11th shot. Stitz said he learned from that game to try to relax when his next opportunity for a perfecto arose.

"I was trying to reflect on that game and I guess it worked," Stitz said.

off as if it was going to be a memorable one for Stitz. "On most of my practice shots, I didn't get many strikes – the opposite of what usually happens," said Stitz, who averages about 200.

"This time I had a tough

time finding the right line. I had Brooklyn strikes in the second and fourth frames. I was thinking I was getting lucky and was wondering if this was going to be a lucky night. Those [Brooklyns] turned out to be my only bad shots."

A 300 has been Stitz's goal since he returned to serious bowling in 2012 at AMF Woodlake Lanes in Woodland Hills. Stitz's next goal is an 800 - his high is 770. He also wants to bowl a clean 30.

"If I get all three, I think I'll change my focus to The night didn't start playing the trumpet," he said. "Music has always been a big part of my life. I always go back to my homecoming [at Reseda High School] and play with the band." As for now, he's still savoring his 300. "I was so happy. It was overwhelming."
